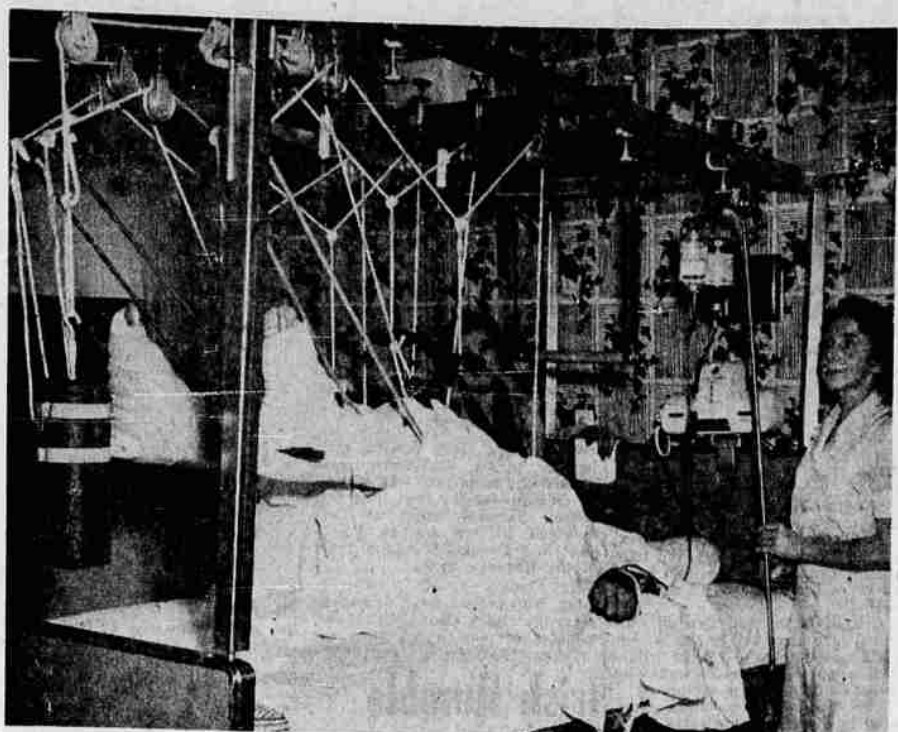

The complex splints are balanced by weights and pulleys. Manager Harry Sanislo of the hospital reports it is the first time he has seen such a rig in operation since he has been here. The Thomas splint with attachments is the preliminary treatment which prevents shortening of muscles and heavy pain. Soon incisions will be made in the legs for insertion of nails for straight healing of the bone.

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Huge Waste Charged In America Voice Funds

WASHINGTON (AP) — Chairman McCarthy (R-Wis.) says his Senate investigations subcommittee is checking on how the Voice of America engineering division is operating under the Eisenhower administration.

A recommendation for such a check was made in a report Sunday by the investigative group that multi-million dollar waste, "incompetence, stupidity, or worse was the rule and not the exception" when the division was operating under Secretary of State Dean Acheson in former President Truman's administration.

McCarthy said in a statement the subcommittee has received information "of continuing waste and abuses of taxpayers' funds." He said it has directed that a new survey be made by engineers who will report within three weeks, after which the subcommittee will call witnesses.

ROME (AP)—Filmdom's latest marital battles, Shelley Winters and Vittorio Gassman, swapped hot words across Italy this week. They agreed their 21-month-old marriage is over, but what happens now is anybody's guess.

Via her attorney, the fiery actress filed suit for separate maintenance in Santa Monica, Calif., yesterday. She asked "reasonable and substantial" support from her handsome Italian husband, and custody of their 11-month-old daughter Vittoria.

Gassman, 36, Milan, where he's playing the lead in a stage production of Shakespeare's "Hamlet," told reporters he wanted a divorce. He said he'll do his duty about family obligations, but "I'll never and in no case drop my right and duties as a good father to my 10-month-old daughter."

"Nice words, but how much?" queried Shelley in Rome, where she's making a film. She added: "As a good father, he ought to know his daughter is 11 months old."

Though her suit mentioned no figure, Shelley has talked in Rome about \$5,000 a year until Vittoria is 18.
