The Appalachian Trail in eastern United States is 2,000 miles long and extends through 14 states, 8 national forests and 2 national parks.



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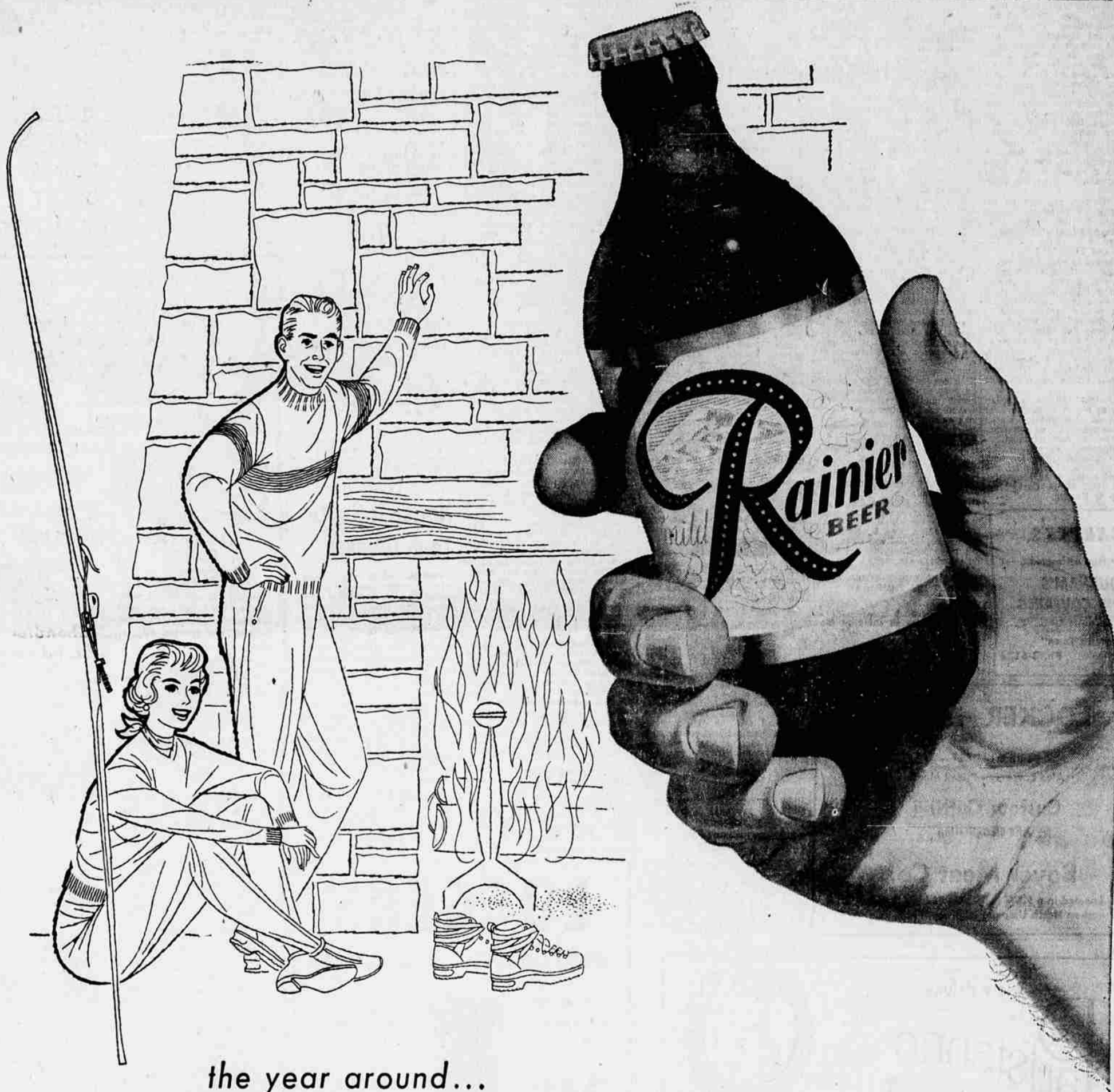


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
