

Mother Of 14 Too Talkative; Jailed 6 Hours

LOUISVILLE, Ky. — A 61-year-old mother of 14 children who "hardly talked at all" served a six-hour jail sentence for violating a judge's new rule of silence.

Mrs. Catherine Purtiler said, "You'd think I was a criminal or something," as she sat in jail following the sentence imposed by Municipal Judge Peter B. Muir.

Mrs. Purtiler, grandmother of 31 children, and Mrs. Dorothy Long, 27, each were charged with contempt of court for talking during the session. The judge had just announced that violators of his new no-talking-or-whispering rule would be fined or jailed.

ADMIRAL DIES

NEW YORK — Adm. Henry Braid Wilson, 82, the nation's oldest admiral, died Saturday in St. Vincent's Hospital. He retired in 1925.

Wilson was commander of U.S. Navy forces on the French coast in World War I. A graduate of the U.S. Naval Academy in 1881, he returned there as superintendent from 1921 until his retirement.

Atomic Engine To Be Placed In Nautilus Feb. 15

WASHINGTON — The atomic reactor which will provide the power for the submarine Nautilus will be put into the boat Feb. 15, Adm. Robert B. Carney, Navy chief of operations, disclosed today in an article written for the current edition of the magazine Nation's Business.

The craft was launched at the Groton, Conn., Jan. 21.

Carney's reference obviously was to the replacement of the fissionable fuel and final details of the shielding against radioactivity. The steam turbine which will get its heat from the atomic "firebox" already was in place when the Nautilus went down the ways.

However, to ease the load on the huge 3,000-ton hull in the launching procedure the hefty weight of the U-235 fuel and the control equipment was left for installation later at the fitting-out dock.

The reactor and propulsion equipment was built by Westinghouse Electric Corp.

Carney, in his article, noted that "the potential energy in a single lump of uranium from which U-235 is processed the size of a golf ball is equivalent to 465,000 gallons of oil, or six million pounds of coal."

The Nautilus, said Carney, gives the United States Navy the lead in atomic seapower, "yet the Nautilus is but the model T of our Navy of tomorrow."

Ransom Money Disappearance Again In News

ST. LOUIS — The St. Louis Post-Dispatch reports about \$20,000 of the missing Greenleaf ransom disappeared from Carl Austin Hall's briefcase between the time of his arrest and the counting of the money at a district police station the following day.

Hall, before his execution in the kidnap-slitting of Bobby Greenleaf, told authorities he had about \$20,000 in the briefcase when arrested Oct. 6.

The newspaper, in a copyrighted story in Sunday morning's editions, said when two special officers counted the recovered money Oct. 7 at the station, the briefcase was empty.

Less than half the \$600,000 ransom paid Hall and his accomplice Mrs. Bonnie Brown Heady, was recovered in two suitcases brought with the briefcase to the station with Hall.

Resigned Lt. Louis Shoulders and suspended Patrolman Elmer Dolan, the arresting officers, are under perjury indictments by a Kansas City grand jury following their testimony on handling of the money. Both pleaded innocent and are free on bond.

Part of the testimony during a police board inquiry in Dolan's perjury indictment, the Post-Dispatch said, quotes Dolan as saying he had the briefcase with him when Hall was recovered to the station and that he put the briefcase in Shoulders' office.

SAN FRANCISCO — Sale by Transamerica Corporation to the First National Bank of Portland, of 15 Oregon banks with 18 offices substantially owned by Transamerica was announced last week by F. N. Belgrano, Jr., chairman of the board and president of Transamerica.

The 18 offices of these banks will become branches of the First National in these Oregon towns and cities: Carlton, Corvallis, Cottage Grove, Eugene, West Eugene, Forest Grove, Lebanon, Monroe, Ontario, Philomath, Portland, Prineville, Seaside, Silverton, Springfield, Sweet Home and Yamhill.

The sale is subject to approval by the comptroller of the currency in Washington, D. C. and the superintendent of banks of Oregon.

Popcorn Grenade Bursts; Youth Killed, Man Hurt

GOSHEN, N.Y. — What started as a prank—stuffing popcorn in an old war souvenir hand grenade and putting it on a stove—resulted in the death of a 16-year-old youth and critical injuries to a restaurant cook.

The youth, Roy Santangelo, had found the grenade in the basement of his father's restaurant.

Roy's sister, Mary 7, entered the kitchen and asked for popcorn. Roy unscrewed the top of the grenade, put in popcorn, and placed it on the stove. The little girl left the kitchen.

A few minutes later the grenade exploded, spraying the room with shrapnel.

Roy was killed and the cook, Charles Unser, 31, was critically injured.

JETTY REPAIR SET

PORTLAND — Army Engineers said Saturday the wrecked freighter Oliver Olson will be moved from the south jetty at the Coquille River so that the jetty can be repaired in the next few months.

Doolittle Says Soviets May Be Ahead Of U. S.

MIDLAND, Tex. — Lt. Gen. Jimmy Doolittle says, "It is extremely likely that the Soviets are ahead of us in the development of the long-range ballistic missile."

The famed Tokyo raider, now an oil company executive, told a Midland Chamber of Commerce meeting last week the fate of civilization may depend on perfection of guided missiles.

"As a result of their own intensive efforts," he said, "together with what they took from the Germans during World War II led in this field, it is extremely likely that the Soviets are ahead of us in the development of the long-range ballistic missile."

Umatilla Welfare Fund Will Be Investigated

PORTLAND — The Umatilla County welfare office, which reported earlier that it had run out of funds to pay medical expenses, is going to be investigated, the State Welfare Commission reported Friday.

Mrs. Loa Howard Mason, state welfare administrator, said the investigation was being made because she wanted it made clear that "no county has exhausted its funds."

"Welfare funds are budgeted by months and by quarters. If a county does need additional money, possibly because it has underestimated its needs, it can receive a supplemental grant," she said.

New Member Appointed To State Bar Governors

PORTLAND — Robert L. Welch of Lakeview Saturday was named a member of the Oregon State Bar board of governors.

He succeeds Paul P. Farrans, Klamath Falls, who died in December.

The board reported that no decision had been reached on a successor for the late Lee W. Karr and that the post of Bar secretary continues to be filled temporarily by Virginia L. Richardson of Portland.

The board's next meeting will be March 19-20 at Pendleton.
