

Grace DeMoss Smith Wins Amateur Title

MIAMI, Fla. (AP) — Just five months after she moved from Oregon to Florida, where golf is played all year around, 26-year-old Grace DeMoss Smith emerged Monday as a bright new star in the women's amateur ranks.

The Coral Gables housewife won the Helen Lee Doherty Amateur Tournament Sunday with a 1-up victory over Mariene Stewart, British champion from Fonthill, Ont., in a rugged 36-hole duel over the star-studded Miami Shores Country Club course.

This would have been scored as a startling upset if Mrs. Smith hadn't previously defeated Mary Lena Faulk of Thomasville, Ga., queen of the American amateurs and winner of the Doherty Cup the last two years, in the semifinals.

It took almost 15 minutes for Henning to take the first with a jackknife pinhold. Gomez cornered the second fall with a body press, but Henning returned for the win with a pin hold in the final fall.
