High Production Of Milk Adds To Selling Trouble

WASHINGTON (AP)—An Agricultural Department survey indicated Thursday that dairy farmers are pouring high-priced, concentrated feed to their dairy cows in an effort to produce more and more milk.

And production figures show that the more milk production increases, the larger grows a butter surplus, which brings demands for reduction of support prices.

Milk production set a record of 120,200,000 pounds during 1953—an increase of 4 per cent over 1952. The previous record was 119,800,000 pounds in 1945.

A report issued Wednesday said milk production in January exceeded nine billion pounds for the first time in history for the month and was 5 per cent greater than in January last year.

The department said the heavy rate of production largely reflected the fact that dairymen are feeding cows a record quantity of concentrated feeds—that is, grains, mixtures of grains and protein meals and the like. These feeds are much more expensive than roughage feeds, such as hay and silage.

U. S. Pakistan Aid Is Assured

WASHINGTON—Diplomatic officials said today the United States has decided to give substantial military aid to Pakistan regardless of India's angry protests.

An American military survey mission, they said, will go to Pakistan to look over its armed forces and determine the amount and type of military equipment needed.

An announcement of the decision probably will be delayed until after Pakistan and Turkey sign a broad defense, economic and cultural agreement, these sources said.

The two countries are reported to be negotiating the pact secretly with U.S. encouragement. The agreement is expected to be announced formally within a matter of days. Pakistan officials are said to be eager to conclude it before next Tuesday's important provincial elections, hoping an announcement would help Premier's Ali's party.
