Advice Is Offered On What To Do At Accident Scene

Do you know what to do if you are first to arrive at an accident scene? If not, you should. The state traffic safety division, Salem, pointed out that knowing what to do, and doing it quickly, might prevent further accidents and save lives.

Here's why: Too often, those directly involved in a collision are in a state of semi-shock and unable to think clearly what to do even though they may not be seriously injured. When this happens, it is up to first-arrivals to help until police arrive.

Second Hollywood Scout Murder Suspect Talks

EL RENO, Okla. (AP) — The second suspect charged with murdering a Hollywood talent scout broke down Tuesday and confessed his part in the crime, Police Chief Lee Harvey reported.

Harvey said Leo J. Denmore, 21, identified by his companion as a deserter from the Canadian Army, signed a statement to his part in the bludgeoning slaying of David L. Johnston, 30-year-old talent scout in California last week. Denmore called his companion's accusation that he—Denmore—actually struck the fatal blow a lie. He swore that Ronald James Maurer, 21, hit Johnston once with a piece of wood, his statement said.

The two were charged with murder Monday in Los Angeles and are awaiting extradition back to California.

Portland Negro Makes Charge Of Discrimination

PORTLAND (AP) — Richard E. Winslow, 25-year-old Portland Negro, said Monday the State Unemployment Compensation Commission had discriminated against him because of his race.

He said he had filed a complaint with Mark A. Smith, deputy state labor commissioner in Portland, accusing the agency of depriving him of rights guaranteed under the state fair employment practices law. Winslow said he based the complaint on an investigation made by a reporter for the Oregon Journal. The newspaper quoted Gordon Shattuck, personnel officer for the commission, as saying that Winslow was not interviewed for a field examiner job partly because his race would be a disadvantage in dealing with the public.

The job has not yet been filled. Silas Gieser, administrator for the commission, said Winslow's name still was on the list of applicants for the job, and denied there had been any discriminatory procedure.

House Committee Approves Setting Back Tax Deadline

WASHINGTON (AP) — The House Ways and Means Committee agreed Tuesday to make April 15 the annual deadline for filing individual tax returns, effective next year.

The committee said in a statement that this change "will greatly relieve the difficulties taxpayers presently have in preparing their returns by the present filing date" of March 15.

As a practical matter, the later date will be helpful to tax accountants and lawyers who now find their major business crowded into the period from Jan. 1 to March 15.

The new date would affect some 55 million individual taxpayers. It was proposed in President Eisenhower's budget message to Congress as part of a general revision of tax laws.

The proposal would not affect filing of returns this year on income earned in 1953. This year's returns will still be due by March 15.

The new schedule makes no change in the March 15 filing date for corporate income taxes. But it extends to Sept. 15 the deadline for filing of returns by tax-exempt cooperatives. The latter date for cooperatives coincides with their last date for declaring patron dividends on the prior year's business.
