WILKES-BARRE, Pa. (AP) — An earthquake-like series of tremors rocked an eight-block residential area Sunday causing extensive damage and disrupting gas and water supplies to some 1,600 persons.

The brief series of earth movements left streets ripped up and partly covered with water from broken mains. Fumes from cracked gas lines resurfaced in an all night vigil by police and firemen.

U. S. Bayonets Disperse S. Koreans At Railway

The Koreans were cleared from the train's after some minor jabbing and shoving, and the train continued to Incheon port without incident.



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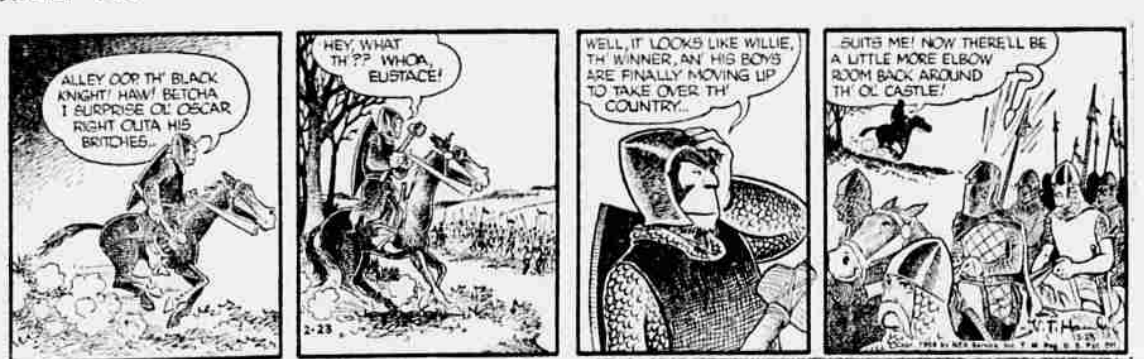
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
