"The High Mountain" has a two-fold purpose: to examine the progress and problems of the American Negro; and to place in better perspective his status and how it affects the cause of democracy on the international scene.

Judge Hastie, who holds the highest judicial office yet attained by an American Negro, has within his own lifetime experienced many of the changes which have affected Negroes during the last 50 years.

Admiral Kirk, former U.S. ambassador to the Soviet Union and Belgium and wartime director of the Office of Naval Intelligence, was able to see at first hand some of the international effects of Communist propaganda about American Negroes.

"The High Mountain" is the tenth in a series of full-hour CBS radio feature project productions covering vital subjects of public interest.
