Army Briefs News Reporters On Action In Peress Case

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Army, which has been the target of "Communist coddling" charges by Sen. McCarthy (R-Wis.), outlined at a briefing session with reporters Friday night its actions in the case of Maj. Irving Peress.

Peress, New York dentist recently given an honorable discharge from the Army, refused to tell McCarthy at a one-man hearing of his Senate investigating committee whether he had ever been a Communist.

It was this incident that precipitated the furor between the Wisconsin senator and Secretary of the Army, Louis C. Howze.

Officials confirmed that the Army made its final decision to give Peress an immediate honorable discharge after McCarthy asked that the dentist be held in the Army for court martial. Peress was discharged Feb. 2.

The officials contended honorable discharge was the best means, under the circumstances, to separate Peress from the service. They said his Army service showed no basis for lodging any court martial charges.

The officials gave the following account of Peress' entry into the Army:

In October, 1952, he was notified he would be drafted under the Medical Draft Law. Under that act, Peress applied for and was given a reserve commission as a Captain on Oct. 15. He took the standard oath to defend the Constitution against all enemies.

On Oct. 27 he was given the standard questionnaire which asked, among other things, whether he had ever been a Communist, Fascist or member of a group advocating violent overthrow of the government. In the space allotted for those questions he noted that he claimed the Fifth Amendment right to refuse to answer.

At that time, officials said, Army rules did not require complete answers to the questionnaire. On Jan. 3, 1953, Peress was called to active duty. One month later, his answers to the questionnaire were noted and the Army started an investigation.

On the basis of a recommendation from Camp Kilmer, N.J., in the summer of 1953, the First Army headquarters in New York, after further procedures, sent to Washington a formal recommendation that Peress be separated.

On Dec. 30 the Army in Washington decided to separate Peress honorably no later than March 30, 1954.

As to Peress' promotion from captain to major in October, 1953, the officials said this was automatic under a law requiring advancement of medical men after fessional services as civilians.

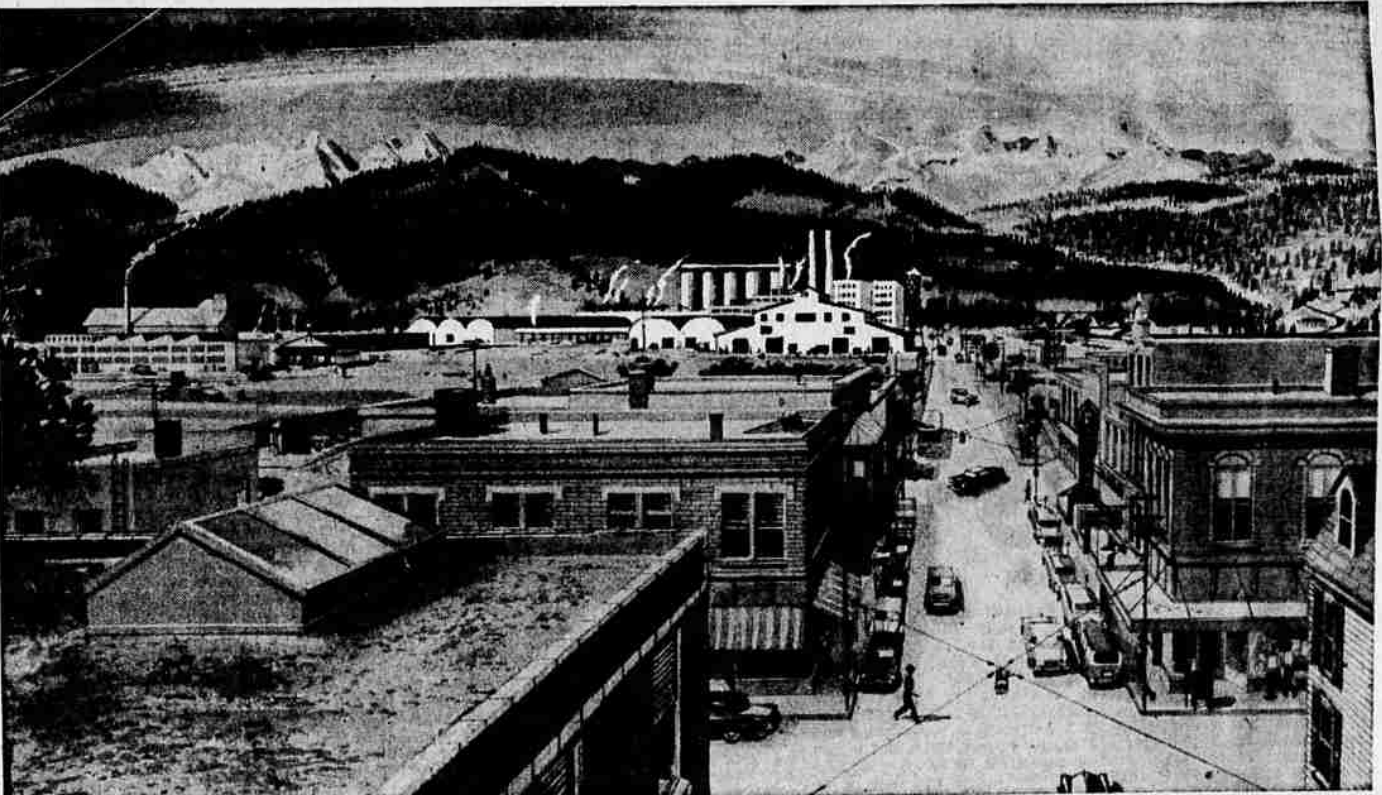

\$206 million invested in 10-year improvement program

During the past 10 years, the Company spent \$206 million on a program of new plant construction, mill modernization, equipment improvement and tree farm roads. New manufacturing units were built for the production of lumber, varied pulp products, plywood, hardboard and a series of new bark and wood fiber products. Hydraulic log barkers and chippers have been installed in most of our wood-processing mills to provide a higher degree of wood used from every log.
