**Chicago Negro Nominated Assistant To Secretary**  
WASHINGTON — President Eisenhower has nominated J. Ernest Wilkins, Chicago Negro attorney, to be assistant secretary of labor.  
"This is the first time, so far as we know, that a Negro has been appointed to a cabinet or sub-cabinet post," White House Press Secretary James C. Hagerly told newsmen.  
The selection of Wilkins is subject to Senate confirmation. He would succeed Spencer Miller Jr., whose resignation, effective March 10, also was announced by Hagerly.

## Color TV For Northwest Ready By Next December

PORTLAND — Network color television programs will be available on two channels in Oregon and Washington by December, the Pacific Telephone & Telegraph Co. reported here Thursday.  
The present channel, which now takes only black and white, will be converted to color use by the time a second new channel is ready before the end of the year, the company announcement said.  
This is for the coaxial cable service from Sacramento running now to KES at Medford and to the Portland stations by way of Eugene and Salem. The same color service then will go north to Tacoma and Seattle by microwave relay.
