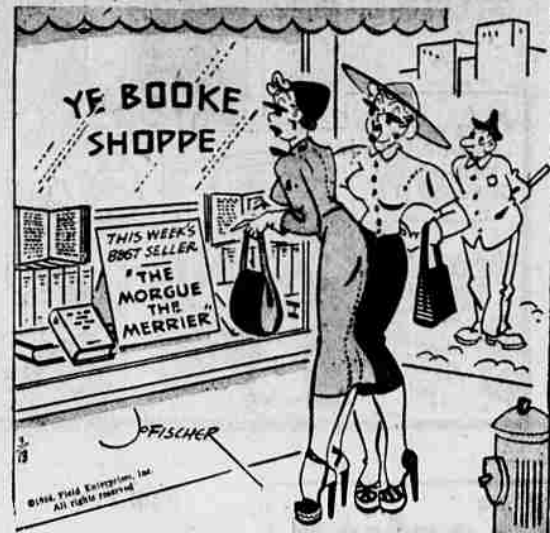
Communist Jets Flee When Sabres Intercept

Jepson said that Sidebotham filed an income tax in 1944 when he worked in the shipyards, but claimed a refund and got it.

Woodworkers Ask Authority To Call Strike

PORTLAND (AP)—The CIO Woodworkers Union, its contract proposals rejected by employers in negotiations just started, Thursday asked for authority to call a strike.

The union also asked the federal mediation service to enter the negotiations.

The strike ballots, to be returned by April 10 and counted April 15, will ask some 45,000 union members in the Pacific Northwest and Northern California to authorize a strike call by the negotiating committee.

Last year when negotiations were deadlocked, the woodworkers voted against a strike.

The union is seeking 12 1/2-cent hourly pay increase, a wage adjustment in job classifications and three weeks vacation after five years with a company.

Seven lumber employers associations rejected these proposals Wednesday and offered to renew the present contract. The union turned this down. The Weyerhaeuser Timber Co. also rejected the union proposals Thursday.

The union was scheduled to meet Friday at Klamath Falls with the Pine Industrial Relations Committee.

BLM Offers For Sale Two Tracts On April 7

Two tracts of timber will be offered at oral auction April 7 by the Bureau of Land Management in its Roseburg office, according to James Watts, district forester.

One tract in the Douglas marketing area contains 1,308,000 board feet of timber valued at \$23,544.55. The block is predominately Douglas fir valued at \$14.85 a thousand. Sugar pine has been appraised at \$36.80, and cedar at \$4.40.

The second tract is in the South Umpqua marketing area, and includes 987,000 board feet appraised at \$6,592.50. Douglas fir has been appraised at \$7.20; sugar pine at \$14.45; and incense cedar at \$3.70. Small amounts of ponderosa pine and white fir also are in the block. Bidding is to start at 10:30 a.m.
