Others present were Karan Wilkinson, Diane Morris and Bernadette St. Onge. Refreshments were served by the leader, Mrs. St. Onge.

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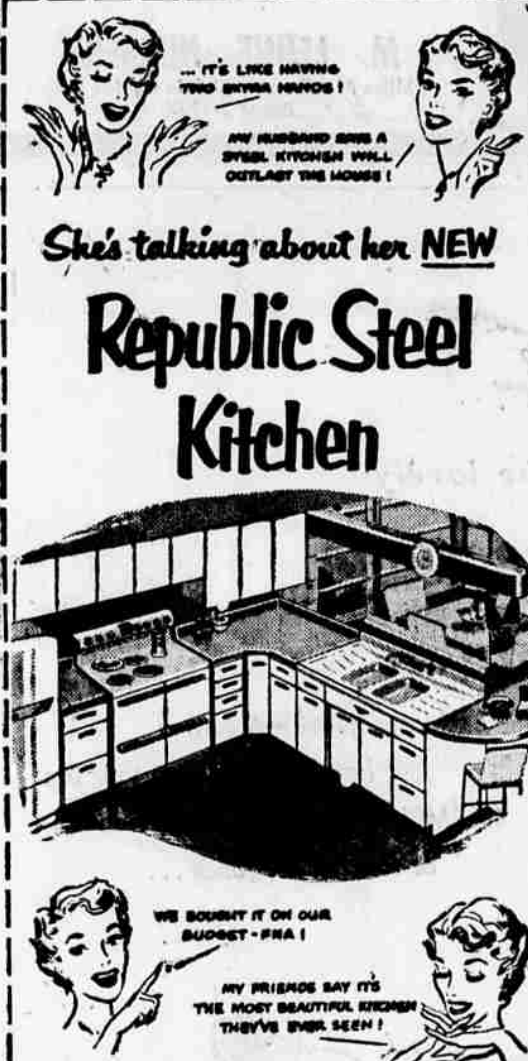
