TOKYO (AP) — Hundreds of Japanese girls, who ordinarily would not be caught dead wearing glasses, are shyly approaching Tokyo optical counters and ordering "vegetables."
Chortling optical salesmen say it's the biggest boom in years.
Some of the girls are buying two and three pairs in different colored frames. Some don't even need glasses but are demanding plain glass in harlequin frames.
"It's all because of that Marilyn Monroe," explained one salesman.
In one of her pictures (How to Marry a Millionaire), now showing in Tokyo, Marilyn plays a near-sighted siren who would rather bump into unopened doors than be caught wearing glasses. Until, that is, her screen boy friend convinces her she is twice as seductive in a pair of harlequin spectacles.
Within two days after the picture opened, optical firms throughout Tokyo had splashed their display windows and cases with harlequin glasses and signs proclaiming: "Marilyn Monroe glasses."
Even the most optimistic salesmen were astounded at the results.

Haymes' Lawyer Doubts Constitutionality Of Law

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Crooner Dick Haymes' attorney doubts the constitutionality of a law that barred the Argentine-born entertainer from entering the United States after visiting Rita Hayworth in Honolulu last summer.

Umpqua Timber Sale Announced

Two tracts of Umpqua National Forest timber, located east of Glide, will be offered to oral bidders in Roseburg on April 20.
One, on Clover Ridge, contains 4,040,000 board feet of timber, predominantly Douglas fir, appraised at \$36,936. Douglas fir has been appraised at \$9.50 a thousand and other species of sawtimber at \$1.90. In addition, deposits of 10 cents a thousand for slash disposal and 55 cents for planting will be required.
The other tract is located on Red Butte. It contains 1,270,000 board feet, again mostly Douglas fir, and is appraised at \$15,198. Douglas fir is worth \$13 and other species \$4.80. Ten cents deposit per thousand for slash disposal and 55 cents for
