Closed Season Slated For Forest Land Areas

SALEM, Ore. — The closed season on 29 million acres of federal, state and private forest lands in Oregon will begin next Thursday, the State Forestry Board announced Friday. The order means that it will be unlawful to burn debris, grass or stubble within 1/4 of a mile of forest lands without permits.

Loggers and sawmill operators were cautioned to have fire fighting equipment ready by April 1, as required by law. Forestry Department inspectors will begin making their inspections of such equipment on April 1.

Forestry Assn. Board Certifies Private Forests. PORTLAND, Ore. — The Industrial Forestry Assn. board of directors Friday certified 19 private forest holdings totaling 6,841 acres as West Coast tree farms.

Five are in Oregon. The largest is the Gustafson Bros. Lost Creek property in Lane County. That totals 4,300 acres.

Others in Oregon are Leville and Frances I. Horner in Linn County, Carl R. and Odille A. Messing in Douglas County, Eldred Caster in Marion County and Drew and Darlene Michels in Polk County.

Oregon now has 79 tree farms totaling 1,665,228 acres in the association's private forestry program, launched in 1940.

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
