Glendale Firm Adds Plumber

The building, planned to be 22' x 44' will be erected on the back of the property, between the new cabinet and repair shop, now under construction, and the gasoline storage tanks on the adjacent service station lot.

The building will house a complete line of plumbing supplies. Much of this stock is already carried by the store, but the addition of a plumber to the store personnel will be an addition to community services.

Construction is already under way on the new 40 x 90 foot cabinet and equipment shop which is being built just behind the main store building.
