

Drain's Henderson And Days Creek's Babb Take Spots In Willamette Relays

Canyonville, Days Creek and Drain track teams each tallied five points in the Willamette Relays at Salem Saturday afternoon.

Drain's Bill Henderson and Bob Babb of Days Creek took third and fourth places respectively in the finals of the senior event which was won by a throw of 170 feet five inches.

First were taken by Jack Couch of Days Creek and Roger Richards of Canyonville. Couch won the first heat of the 120-yard high hurdles in 18.7 and Richards won the first heat of the 100 yard dash in 11.2.

Jack Rogers of Drain took a

third place in the eighth heat of the 100 yard dash which was won in the time of 10.8 by John Yost of Corvallis.

The Canyonville relay team captured points with a sixth place finish in the second heat of the 880-yard relay event.

SALEM — Five track and field records were established Saturday as an estimated 2,000 students from 69 high schools competed in the fourth annual Willamette Relays.

Gerald Kinnaman, of Centralia, Wash., the individual star of the meet, posted one of the meet records with a 133-foot discus

throw. Gerald Falls, of Vancouver, Wash., threw the discus 151 feet, 6 3/4 inches for the senior record.

Don Marshall of St. Helens set a senior shotput record—51 feet, 6 1/2 inches.

Salem and Vancouver teams tied at 48.1 seconds to establish a 440-yard relay mark, and Salem set another record in the two-mile relay with a time of 8 minutes, 44.5 seconds.

Kinnaman led the field with three individual victories—the novice high jump, the discus and a 120-yard hurdle heat. Duane Keranan of Vancouver, Wash., posted two individual victories—the senior high jump and broad jump.

No official team totals were kept. However, under a 5-3-1 point system for the first three places in each event, Salem led the field with 56 points.

A new mile relay mark of 3:27 was set by Seattle Pacific. The University of Washington established a new standard in the sprint medley relay at 7:34.3. And Mathew Air Force Base's Kenneth Mischal took the 120-yard high hurdles in 15.1 another meet record.

No team scores were kept for the meet.

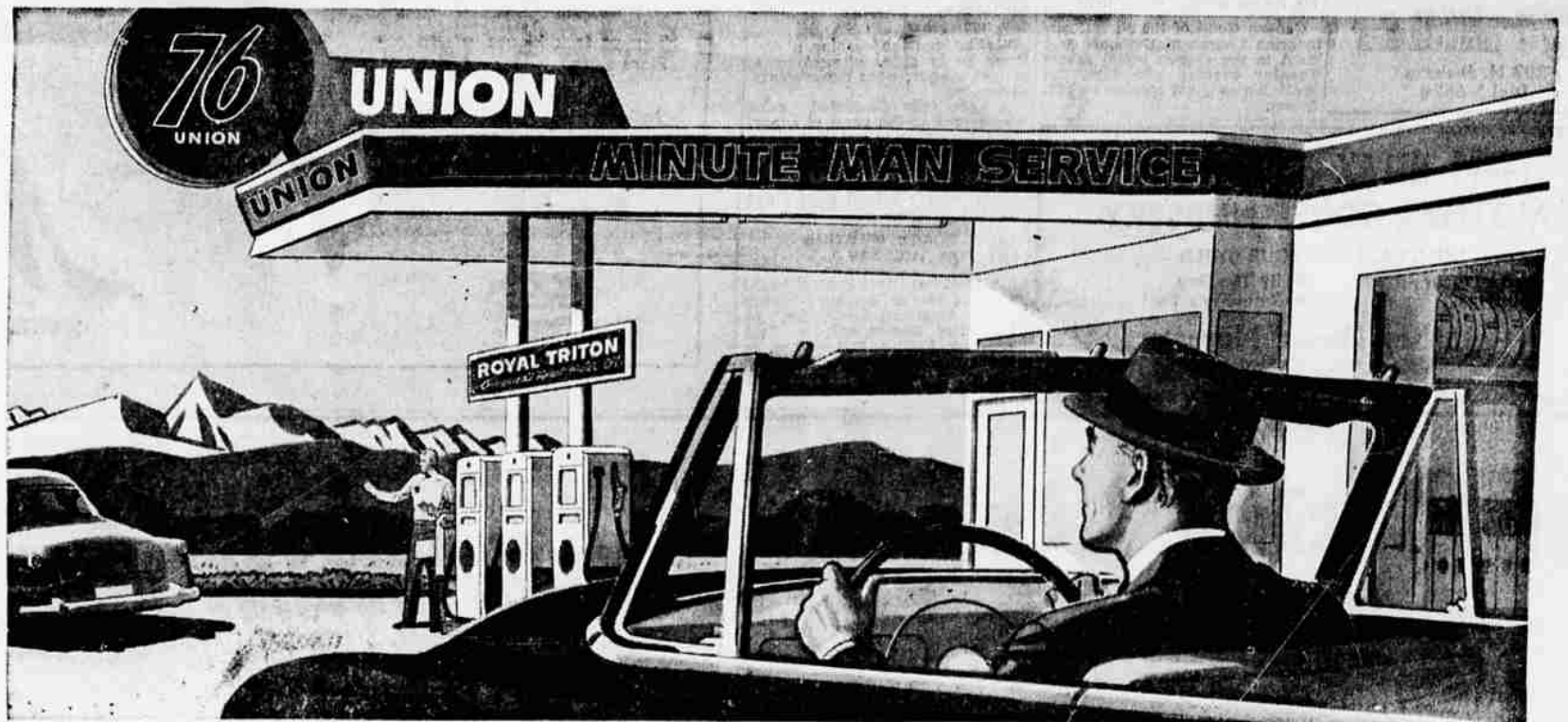
