Scotsman and prospective bridegroom (mail order) is acted by John Herbert. Several other characters

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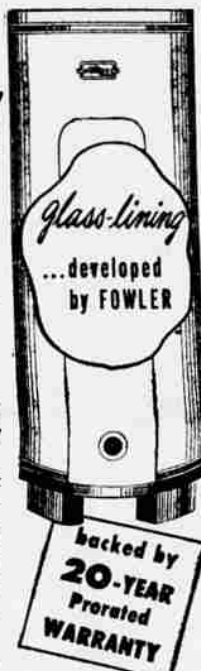

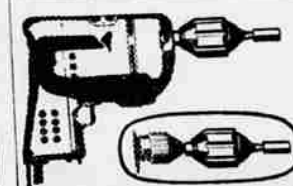
