

March Building Permits Climb

Building permits in March for Roseburg took a 94 per cent jump over February, according to a report from the Equitable Savings & Loan Assn. statistical department.

The report showed, however, that the March figure was far below the figure of a year ago. Permits for March 1954 totaled \$150,285. This figure was almost double the February figure of \$82,129. However, last year's March saw permits filed totaling \$218,273, a figure 45 per cent above this year's March.

Dollar value of residential, industrial, commercial and civic building for the entire northwest during the first three months of this year reached a healthy \$56,559,819, the report showed. However, it was pointed out that the commercial, industrial and civic gain over 1953 leans heavily on building. Residential construction has fallen \$11,423,333 behind the 1953 first quarter.

March was a decisive month in almost every area beside Roseburg, the report states. The area surveyed includes Idaho, Oregon and Washington as well as British Columbia. March showed \$29,593,517 for the month, a rise of 62 per cent over February.
