South Koreans Block Red Sabotage Attempt

SEOUL, (AP)—The Defense Ministry says South Korean army intelligence men blocked a plot to blow up railroads and bridges with the arrest of 15 Communist agents. The Reds slipped out of their retreat in the Chiri Mountains of southwest Korea last week to set up underground cells for sabotage. They were arrested in Ha-long, west of Pusan.

SEOUL (AP)—South Korea's defense minister, Adm. Sohn Won-say, says his government will soon ask the United States for 160 million dollars more a year in military aid. He said Korea's military budget exceeds its total revenue by 120 percent.

It was 5 p.m. Monday in Baghdad (Tuesday in Berkeley) and the bridegroom, Dr. David S. Ali, had rushed to the phone immediately after the marriage ceremony with her father—who stood in as a proxy.

She met Dr. Ali two years ago in Baghdad and, following a brief courtship, their parents agreed to the marriage. Proxy papers were forwarded to Miss Ismail at Berkeley, signed and returned via the Iraqi Embassy in Washington.

Said—Mrs. Ali now—came to the University of California in December to study for a doctor's degree in education.

Dr. Ali plans to arrive in June for a graduate course in medicine at Stanford.

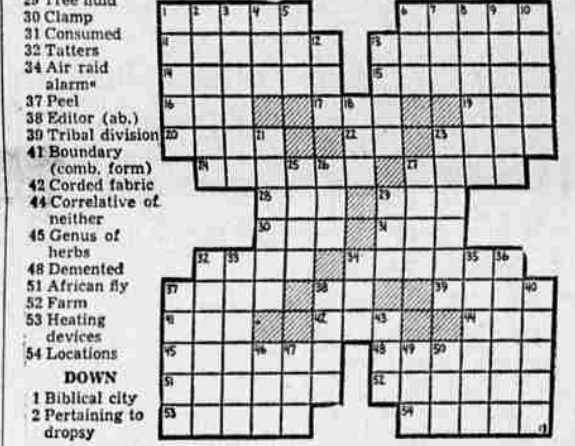
