Reuther Scores Tax Reductions

WASHINGTON — CIO President Walter Reuther said Tuesday the administration's tax revision bill actually is a tax reduction measure embracing "concessions for corporations and wealthy stockholders."

"It is a giveaway program for those groups in our economy who, at this particular point in time, need no tax relief," he declared in testimony prepared for the Senate Finance Committee holding hearings on the bill.

Reuther urged the committee to amend the House-approved bill by making a 4 1/2-billion-dollar general income tax cut this year, and an 8-billion reduction in 1955 and thereafter.

At the same time, he said the two biggest revenue-losing provisions in the bill should be eliminated. These are a section to give tax relief to stockholders on their dividend income, for an estimated revenue loss of 240 million dollars the first year, and 814 million annually thereafter; and one to permit corporations to take faster depreciation allowances on their taxes for an estimated loss of 300 million the first year.

In 1907-08, Selander worked for The Oregonian as a sports cartoonist. He has had one-man shows in pencil renderings and oil paintings in Virginia, Portland and Salem, and father-and-son shows in various cities of Oregon and Washington.

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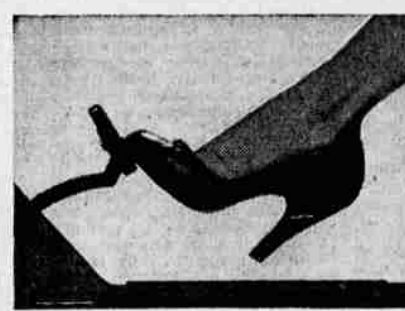
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
