More Chipping Of Windshields Now Reported

CLEVELAND (AP)—More and more persons were chipping in with theories but the reason automobile windshields suddenly developed dimples still was a mystery Wednesday.

Two-hundred new pock-marked windshields have been reported here to add to the thousands previously reported throughout the country.

Explanations ranged from vandalism to radioactivity and from grit to gromlins. Some even thought it really wasn't happening. But nobody seemed sure.

One theory—that radioactivity caused the chips, dents, scratches, or whatever they are—apparently was eliminated last week when Navy officials ruled out the possibility.

But Tuesday a scientist at Antioch College in Yellow Springs, Ohio, said he found radioactive material in dirt samples taken from tops of cars whose windshields were mysteriously pock-marked.

MOSCOW (AP)—The Soviet government announced the biggest budget in its history tonight for 1954. It includes 100,300,000 rubles—17.8 per cent—for national defense.

School Growth Traced At W-D Kiwanis Meeting

William Bromley, superintendent of school district 116, this week traced the last 10 years of school growth in the area south of Roseburg at the Winston-Dillard Kiwanis Club Meeting.

Speaking at the Melody Inn, Bromley related that the most startling change has come in the number of districts involved. Ten years ago, no less than 10 districts were extant in the area. The biggest was Lookingglass with four paid instructors. By 1949-50, that number had been cut to five districts. Dillard, with 362 students and 10 teachers, was the biggest at this point.

With more consolidations, the sprawling district 116 has increased from 449 to almost 1,700 youngsters. The elementary population has jumped from 240 to the present 961. Next year, the district will have 61 certified personnel.

Reflecting the sprawling character of the district, it contains about 250 square miles. Its southernmost boundary is just a half-mile from Nickel Mountain. To the west, it borders the Coos Bay district. It reaches east to the Roberts Creek School District and north to Coon Hollow, three miles south of Dillard.
