

Cordon's Bill Would Continue Pacific Trust

WASHINGTON (R-Ore) — Sen. Guy Cordon (R-Ore) Monday introduced a bill calling for the government to continue indefinitely control over the Trust Territory of the Pacific.

The bill also would authorize expenditure of 7 1/2 million dollars annually to cover administrative costs.

Responsibility for administration of the islands was transferred in 1951 and again in 1953 to the Department of the Interior. Cordon's bill would continue this indefinitely.

Plans for reconstruction of Hayhurst Road, running west out of Yoncalla and connecting to Highway 38 west of Drain, were presented recently to the Yoncalla city council and residents on the road.

Frear said tile and a rock ballast will be placed down, and he advised the city to use the same method in rebuilding the road within the city limits. will start about June 1, and the county will pave between the old and new Highway 99 routes. The State Highway Dept. will pave the road between Scotts Valley underpass on the new highway to Scotts Valley School.
