Local Firms Put On List By FHA

PORTLAND, Ore. — Guy F. Arrington, head of the Federal Housing Administration here, Friday made public locally names of firms and individuals on a "precautionary measures" list.

The full national list was released in Washington Thursday by Sen. Capehart (R-Ind) and he called it a blacklist. Sen. Lehman (D-Lib-NY) said, though, that while the list was of those with whom lending agencies were cautioned not to deal without special precautions, it was not a blacklist. He said those on the list were "largely a number of little fellows" who might well have cleared themselves since the list was compiled.

Arrington confirmed that more than 125 Oregon firms and individuals were listed.

The list included: Evans and Holmes Insulation Co., William L. Evans and Otto C. Holmes of Roseburg; Mark P. Warendt of Roseburg and Salem.
