Segregation Test In Mississippi Is Due In Court

JACKSON, Miss. — Mississippi's program to equalize Negro and white schools faced a legal but shaky future here, with the U. S. Supreme Court holding the trump cards.

The legislature has put the final reluctant touches to the program still fearing the high court may abolish segregation.

In the same breath, the Legislature set up a committee of "who's who" in Mississippi government to find ways to dodge any decision outlawing segregation.

Segregation in public schools will be maintained, whatever the Supreme Court rules on the segregation cases before it.

The House months ago resolved to resist co-mingling of races by "every lawful means" in this state, where whites have only a slim numerical advantage over Negroes.

Fear of the pending Supreme Court decision influenced six months of legislative work and forced equalization advocates to settle for a compromise one-year trial run at a reduced cost of \$4 million dollars. The original program was estimated to cost \$3 million a year. The state's normal school budget would be 25 million.
