OSC Scholarship Open To High School Student

The Douglas County Extension office in Roseburg has mailed out information to all high schools in the county announcing a new scholarship.

The 19 Douglas County home extension units will finance a \$100 scholarship for some deserving boy or girl who is being graduated from a Douglas County high school and is planning to enter the freshman class at Oregon State College. The student may take any course he wishes.

The scholarship winner will be named by the end of May. This is the first time the extension units have combined forces to finance such an award.

Applications will parallel those for state scholarships. The scholarship will be based on financial need, scholastic ability, contribution to school and community, specialized and general activity, character and general recommendation.

A student must fill out the standard state system scholarship application, which he may secure from his principal. The extension unit chairman in the area from which the student is sending his application must then approve the form. The application then goes back to the Douglas County Extension Committee, with the address of post office box 512, Roseburg.

Final selection will be made by the extension committee with the advice of the scholarship committee at Oregon State College.

Tito Still Supports European Defense Plan

BELGRADE, Yugoslavia — Communist Yugoslavia reaffirmed Tuesday her support for the proposed six-nation European Defense Community and restated willingness to join the community under certain conditions.

A position previously outlined by President Marshal Tito was detailed by Foreign Secretary Koca Popovic at a meeting of parliament's foreign affairs committee. Popovic said Yugoslavia's new policy primarily resulted from the Berlin conference's failure to solve the German problem.

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Capt. Barney Back From South Sea Islands To 'Make A Living'

"A man can't stay in paradise forever if he has to make a living," says R. H. Barney.

Barney is the Douglas County man, formerly of Camas Valley and Tenmile and now located at Winston, who received nationwide publicity a few years ago when he sailed alone to the South Sea Islands.

He has recently returned from another such voyage, but this time he had company.

Barney and Lorren Smith, the latter of Long Beach, Calif., sailed Jan. 20 from the Long Beach harbor in a 30-foot ketch.

"We started too early," said Barney, "and had bad weather most of the way."

They lost two sets of sails. The main boom was broken.

"But we had no serious trouble and were in no real danger. We had a good boat," he said.

"We never missed a morning without our pancakes for breakfast."

The first landfall was at Tiahue on Nukuhiva, one of the Marquesas Islands.

"We spent three weeks there," Barney said. "I have many friends

First Results On Rural School Budget Are Split

The first two districts reporting results of the county rural school districts' budget vote Monday show a split. In addition, Yoncalla elementary school district voters turned down a continuing levy for school expansion.

Myrtle Creek voters favored the rural elementary budget by 48-12 and the rural high school budget by 47-13. Yoncalla turned each down by like votes of 46-42.

The rural elementary school budget called for a levy of \$38,438.03 over the 6 per cent limitation on a budget of \$1,305,037. In the rural high school district, the total budget is \$737,186, with an excess of \$30,722 on the levy.

The results from the two communities by no means indicates final outcome of the budgets. Some 20 school districts in Douglas County voted. Deputy School Supt. W. M. Campbell said full results may not be obtained before Thursday.

In addition in Yoncalla, elementary school voters turned down a measure for a continuing levy of \$10,000 a year over five years for expansion of the school. Vote was 50-38.
