

Track, Tennis Men To Converge Here Saturday

Roseburg becomes the mecca of sports activity for Douglas and Coos counties Saturday as tennis and track teams of the two political divisions converge upon the high school campus for state and district qualifying action.

Starting at 9 a.m., net teams from Marshfield and North Bend join the Oregon dual meet champions of Roseburg in a series of elimination matches to determine entries for the state meet at Corvallis, May 28-29.

At 11:30 a.m., 19 class A & B track teams take the field to win or lose berths for the district meets which are scheduled for next week.

Besides deciding qualifiers for the district meet, Saturday's track meet in Roseburg will produce a sub-district titlist in both A & B divisions.

Netmen Eye State

About 30 participants are expected for all-day tennis action to decide the winners of two singles and two doubles positions in the state tourney.

Each team is allowed to enter as many individuals as it pleases with the stipulation that an individual cannot take part in both

singles and doubles play. Coach Al Hoffman of Roseburg anticipates at least 11 opening round singles matches and anywhere from eight to 11 doubles matches. Roseburg will field three doubles teams and five singles players.

North Bend and Marshfield are expected to play two doubles teams and from three to five singles matches.

Although seedings are not yet complete, Ron Gunther of North Bend is a heavy favorite to annex singles honors while Roseburg's dynamic doubles team of Don Carter and Wayne Stenning are top-heavy favorites to win their specialty.

Singles and doubles finalists will earn the trip to the state tournament.

Pirates, Indians Favored

Roseburg and Marshfield, county champions, are co-favorites to collect the most numbers in the 11-team Class A track meet.

Other Douglas County entrants include Sutherlin, the county runner-up, Drain, Reedsport and Myrtle Creek. North Bend, which is favored for a third place team finish Saturday, leads the rest of the Coos contingent which includes Bandon, Myrtle Point and Coquille.

The B meet resembles a repeat of the County B meet as all eight teams vie for Class B sub-district honors are Douglas County participants. There were no Coos County entries.

The strong field of teams, led by Canyonville's county B champs, also include Yoncalla, Days Creek,

Riddle, Glide, Oakland, Camas Valley and Douglas.

The Tigers and Eagles are expected to hash it out for first team place as they did in the county meet with Douglas and Days Creek expected to finish in third and fourth places.

Canyonville is strong in the distance races and the weight events while Yoncalla bears more sprint power. Douglas will contend in the hurdles, the sprints and the relay. Days Creek should earn points in the field contests.

Among the Class A teams, the Coos entries are expected to win most of the blue ribbons. Marshfield, in particular, is favored in the hurdle and sprint events.

Coos teams have better times for the season in six of the eight running events and have better distances in all six field events. To offset this coastal power, Coach Frank Purdy's Roseburg Indians have mustered strength in the distance and weight departments to pick up numerous places and points.

Only Wayne Card of Sutherlin, running the high hurdles, and Roseburg miler Mark Robbins, appear to be certain Douglas County winners.

Both Marshfield and Roseburg should land 20 places during the 14 events according to the pre-race dope, with North Bend expected to pick up 12 places. Myrtle Point is favored to lead Sutherlin 12 places to 10.

State's Best

The list of entries and their records includes some of the state's best so far this season, including Robbins' 4:32.9 mile and Johnny Johnson's 10.3 100-yard dash mark for Marshfield.

Some of the outstanding field

event figures include Willard Reeve's 152-3 discus throw and 53-10% shot put; Dick Woolstenhulme's 5-9% high jump mark and the 168-3 javelin heave by Don Graham. All three participants are from North Bend, which is expected to score heavily in these events.

In the running events, close contests are expected in the hurdles, both the 100 and 220-yard dashes and the 880-yard run. Clear-cut favorites have been established, however, all down the line on the basis of past performances.

A new state ruling this year allows only four boys to qualify for the district meet from 100, 220 and the two hurdle events, in past years, six have qualified from each.

In all other events six participants will qualify, including six relay teams.

Preliminaries in the sprints and hurdles and all of the B field events will begin at 11:30 Saturday. At 2:30, all the A field events will be conducted and one hour later the finals in both A & B running events are slated.
