New Drug May Check Blindness

LOS ANGELES — One of the foremost causes of blindness apparently can be held in check by a recently discovered drug which started out as an aid in the treatment of heart disease.

The surprise benefits of this chemical were reported today to the California Medical Assn. by Dr. Earle McBain of San Rafael, Calif., an eye specialist of the Stanford University Medical School.

The drug known commercially as diamox, dramatically reduces fluid pressure in the eyeball. This pressure causes glaucoma.

Glaucoma is one of the most common causes of blindness. Fluid pressure in the eyeball builds up until it affects the nerves responsible for vision.

Diamox, in reducing the pressure, at least temporarily stays the progress of blindness and gives doctors a new chance to intervene with other forms of treatment against the loss of sight. It is being used experimentally in several research centers.
