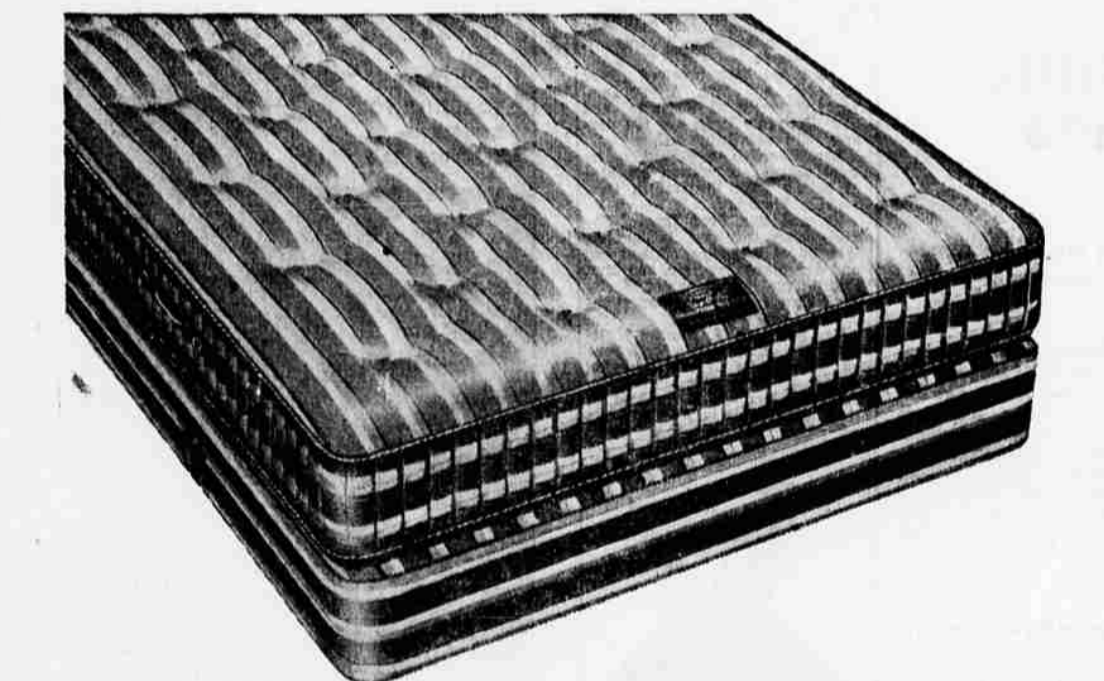

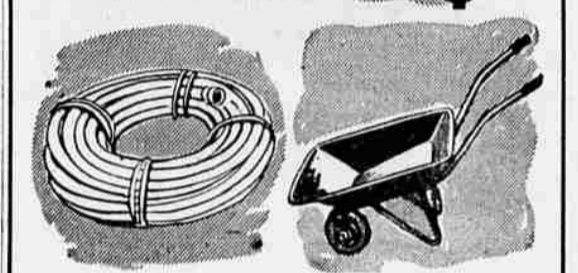

\$4 Million Suit Filed In 'Champagne Safari'
LOS ANGELES (AP) — A four-million-dollar suit has been filed in connection with "Champagne Safari," the movie account of the African hunting trip taken by Rita Hayworth and Moslem Prince Aly Khan on their honeymoon. Defense Film Corp., the distributor, brought the court action, complaining that the film has been maliciously and wrongfully kept from the screen. The suit was filed against Beckwith Corp., financial backers of the venture, and Columbia Pictures, Inc. Harry Cohn, president of Columbia, also is named as a defendant. Miss Hayworth, who is now the wife of crooner Dick Haymes, is under contract to Columbia, and the pact provides that Columbia must give permission for her appearance in any film.

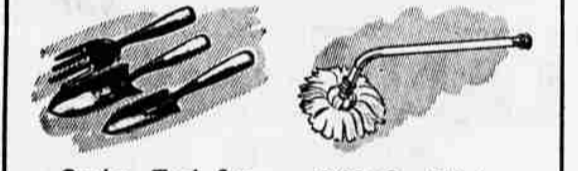

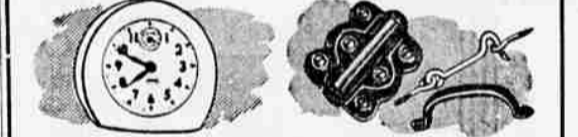
