Lawyer Says Haymes Is Victim Of Official Effort

WASHINGTON — Dick Haymes' lawyer charges that the Argentine-born crooner is the victim of an official effort to get him out of the country by "any means, moral or immoral."
Webburn Maycock, Haymes' Washington attorney, so argued Tuesday in seeking to convince the Board of Immigration Appeals to set aside a government deportation order pending against the singer.
The board took the case under consideration after hearing Maycock's arguments. The government said it would let its case against Haymes stand on the record, but might file a brief later.
The government contends Haymes lost his eligibility for citizenship when during World War II he claimed exemption as an alien from the draft. It brought its deportation action against the 35-year-old singer after Haymes visited Hawaii last June to be with movie actress Rita Hayworth, whom he later married. The government contended Haymes left the country and re-entered illegally.

Fire Destroys Lloyd Dement Home At Elkton

Mr. and Mrs. Lloyd Dement of Elkton, who lost their home by fire Wednesday, have been plagued with blazes.
There have been three fires at the house, which is located next to the new Elkton High School gym. Correspondent Mrs. C. W. Henderer points out.

Public May Not Hear Monitored Phone Calls

WASHINGTON — The public may never read or hear in the participants' original words those monitored telephone conversations between Sen. McCarthy (R-Wis.) and Secretary of the Army Stevens and their aides.
It was learned authoritatively Wednesday that Ray H. Jenkins, special counsel for the Senate subcommittee investigating the McCarthy-Stevens row, and Joseph N. Welch, Army counsel, have agreed the transcribed conversations cannot be made public without the consent of both parties.
The two lawyers have held it would be a violation of the Federal Communications Act to ignore the protest of either of the participants to a conversation to put the investigation now underway, stipulation, accepted by Chairman Mundt (R-SD), that all or none of the transcribed chats must go into the record.
