Adenauer Says West Must Not Slacken Efforts

STRASBOURG, France (AP) — West German Chancellor Konrad D. Adenauer told Western Europe Thursday it must not slacken efforts to build up a common defense against the threat from the East.

He told the European Consultative Assembly's ministerial council the Russian aim still is to extend the Soviet sphere of influence and deprive the whole world of freedom.

"Nor is the course which the Geneva Conference has taken such as to offer encouragement," he added. The 78-year-old statesman said the Berlin Conference had led to complete inflexibility on both sides. Again at Geneva "we have hitherto not been able to register any genuine willingness on the part of the Soviet Union and its partners to permit a true relaxation of tension to come about."

Fraternity Shooting Is Ruled As Suicide
 CHAPEL HILL, N. C. (AP) — The fatal shooting of a student in a University of North Carolina fraternity house here Saturday was ruled suicide by a coroner's jury. The jury found that Putnam Davis, 23, senior art student from Larchmont, N.Y., shot himself with a pistol borrowed from a fraternity brother following an all-night session of beer drinking and listening to records. Wounded in the shooting were Allen Long, 21, of Chevy Chase, Md., and William H. Joyner, 20, of Summit, N.J.
