

Norblad Plugs For Seattle Site

WASHINGTON — Rep. Norblad (R-Ore), a member of the House Armed Services Committee, Wednesday sided with Seattle in its fight with San Francisco over the location of the Army's base for overseas troop movements. He told newsmen he hoped the recent decision to transfer staging operations to the Seattle-Tacoma area might be the beginning of a move to place more emphasis on the Pacific Northwest and less on the bay area.

"The concentration of naval and military bases in the Oakland-San Francisco area is altogether too great," Norblad said, "for in the event of hostilities they would certainly offer a prime target for any enemy."

"Many of these bases can and should be placed in the Northwest," Norblad said he considered the location of Northwest ports "much closer to the Orient . . . (as) certainly of importance in the shipment of troops and material either in peacetime or in time of war."

Ft. Monmouth Officer Asks For Retirement

EATONTOWN, N. J. — The Army's chief intelligence officer at Ft. Monmouth, which has been the target of a probe by Sen. McCarthy's Senate Investigations subcommittee, has applied for retirement on health grounds.

Andrew J. Reid, 54, Eatontown, has been in the civilian post since 1946. He said he suffered a heart attack Dec. 27 and has not been back on the job since. He said last night he applied for retirement April 6.

Reid was praised by McCarthy for doing a good job at Ft. Monmouth. The intelligence agent had testified before the subcommittee in Washington Dec. 9.

McCarthy claimed an espionage ring operated at the supersecret radar laboratories in the fort. A loyalty-security check there resulted in the suspension of 35 civilian employees, some of whom were later reinstated. Secretary of the Army Robert Stevens said there was no record of current espionage there.

YMCA Seeking Nurse For Summer Session

The YMCA is looking for a nurse to attend the summer camp session at Diamond Lake, starting July 1, reports Camp Director Don Naden.

Naden states that a practical nurse will be needed at least. He says work would be voluntary. Although no pay is involved Naden points out it would make a good vacation for the nurse. He asks that anyone interested call him at the YMCA office in Roseburg.

Other key personnel has already been chosen. Program director is Richard Turley and Camp cook is Mrs. J. H. Terrell.

General To Talk Plans To Train Native Armies

SAIGON, Indochina — Maj. Gen. John W. O'Daniel is expected to leave Saturday for Manila to discuss with Defense Secretary Charles Wilson eventual U. S. participation in training native armies in Indochina.

The chief of the military and advisory mission here will carry with him fresh impressions of visits to training centers in Viet Nam, Laos and Cambodia as well as important conversations a few days ago with France's chief of staff, Gen. Paul Ely.

O'Daniel, who has been an advocate of American aid in training the Vietnamese, is believed to have received some encouragement from Ely. The details of their talk, however, have not been officially disclosed. Ely was described as firmly opposed to such a move during his visit to Washington last month.

O'Daniel broke his visit to Cambodia to attend the meeting with Ely and U. S. Acting Ambassador Robert McClintock. Upon his return he inspected the military school at Pursat, 60 miles north of Phnom Penh, accompanied by Gen. Tiou Long, commander of the Cambodian army.

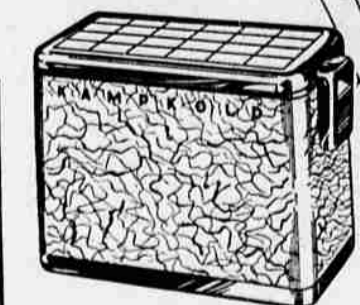
