PORTLAND — Charles A. Sianey, operator of Timberline Lodge, bid \$5,100 Tuesday for Portland radio station KLIQ which was being auctioned by the federal government for back taxes. 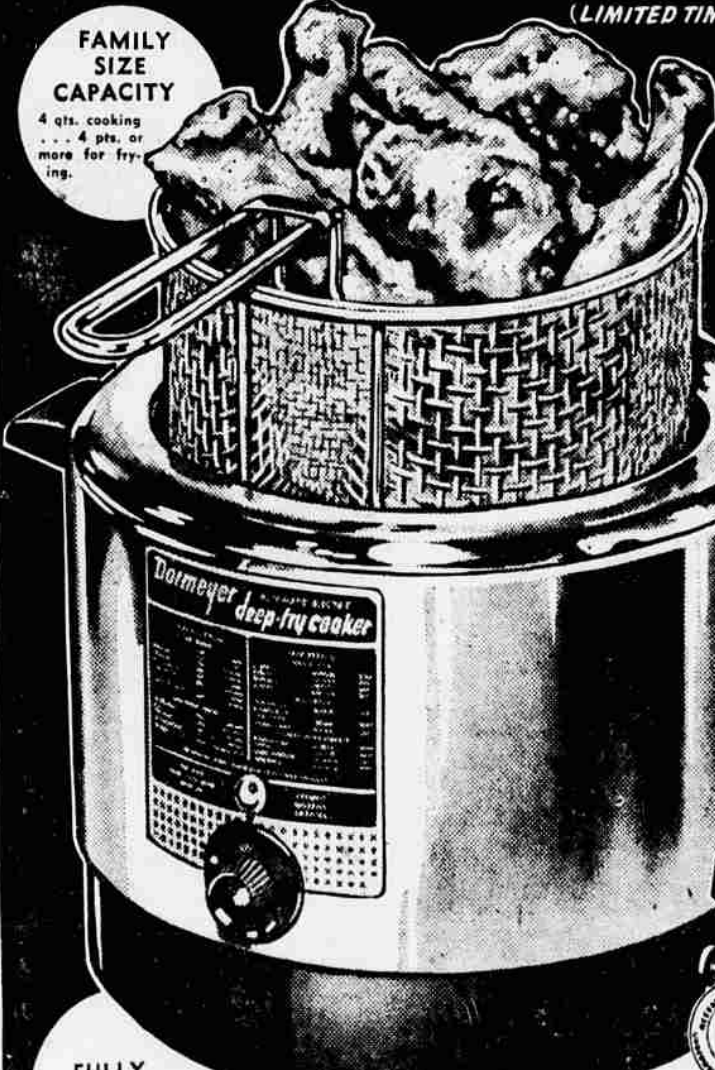
