British Labor Delegates To Make Red China Visit

LONDON — The British Labor Party executive has decided to send a delegation, including former Prime Minister Clement Attlee and Leftist Leader Archibald Bevan, to Communist China this summer for a two-month visit. The visit, in August and September, will be in response to an invitation from the Communist Chinese People's Institute of Foreign Affairs, the Labor Party said. Britain recognized the Communist regime in January 1950 while the laborites were in power, but as tried in vain since for the exchange of full diplomatic missions.
