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Five Members Of Family Seek Accident Pay

Separate damage actions by five members of one family, totaling \$202,200, have been filed in circuit court against Walton Darl Phillips, records show.

The suits grew out of a traffic accident on Highway 99 about four miles south of Yoncalla on Nov. 1, 1953. A. J. Felton and members of his family allege Phillips was reckless and negligent in the mishap. It is claimed Phillips' car was traveling in the wrong lane of traffic and struck the Felton car head-on.

Actions on behalf of the three Felton daughters were filed by Bessie Holmes, guardian ad litem. Victoria Jan Felton, then 7, seeks \$65,000 general and \$1,000 special damages. Amanda Jill Felton, then 11, seeks \$55,000 general and \$450 special damages. JoAnne Felton, then 5, seeks \$14,000 and \$150 special damages. Joanne M. Felton seeks \$60,000 general and \$1,500 special damages. A. J. Felton seeks \$55,000 general and \$100 special damages.
