523 Deaths Are Reported Over Nation

George Wishon, Mrs. Mildred Shaffner Are Victims Of Accident

Douglas County's 10th and 11th traffic fatalities of the year added to the nation's heavy death toll over the long Memorial Day weekend.

Two motorcyclists met death Saturday evening just south of Myrtle Creek on Highway 99 when their vehicle sideswiped a truck.

Coroner L. L. Powers said George R. Wishon, 46, Camas Valley Star Route, and Mrs. Mildred Shaffner, 40, were killed instantly.

State police said the accident occurred at 5:25 p.m. Wishon was driving the motorcycle over the pickup on a curve, officers said. The motorcycle driver failed to get back in the right lane before slicing into the side of a truck driven by Warren Joseph Maddox of Myrtle Creek.

Record Number Deaths Reported Over Nation

Violent deaths over the three-day Memorial Day holiday period soared to a new record Tuesday.

At least 523 persons died in traffic accidents, drownings, and miscellaneous mishaps. This broke the previous record of 510 for a three-day Memorial Day holiday in 1952.

The traffic toll was at least 355, or 15 above the National Safety Council's pre-holiday estimate of 340 and near the record of 363 in 1952. An additional 92 lost their lives in drownings, and 76 in miscellaneous accidents.

President Eisenhower Tuesday expressed distress over the "very high highway fatalities" over the holiday. He said something could be done about it if the nation puts its mind to the problem.

Oregon Highway Deaths Reach 8 For Holidays

The highway death toll in Oregon over the long Memorial Day weekend stood at eight Tuesday.

A number of persons were in hospitals being treated for critical injuries.

Four Hospitalized After Collision

Four persons were taken to Myrtle Creek Hospital Saturday night after a head-on collision on Highway 99 about a mile south of Canyonville, state police report.

Showing satisfactory improvement today were the passengers in the two cars involved, Audrey A. Swoope, 48, Medford, and Gertrude Smith, 25, Canyonville.

Smith's brother, Wayne Dale, 28, was discharged from the hospital Monday. Mrs. Swoope's husband, Thomas William, 53, was given outpatient treatment Saturday night.

Officers said the accident occurred at 9:45 p.m. as Wayne Smith attempted to make a left turn off the highway and into the Swoope car headed east. The victims were picked up by Garza ambulance.

In Roseburg, Clayton Jack Finch, 32, Kohnkegen Apts., was cited for failure to yield right-of-way when his car and one driven by Gary Crabb, 17, 2010 Eden Lane, collided at Main and Lane streets Sunday afternoon. Damage to the cars totaled about \$300, city police estimated.

Other minor accidents were reported throughout the county during the weekend, but no serious injuries were reported.

Portland Man, Woman Held On Vagrancy Counts

A man and woman, both of Portland, were arrested Saturday night and held in the county jail on charges of vagrancy. They are Albert Allen Jones, 35, and Lois Ellen Sullivan, 32.

Roseburg police said that a morals investigation is being made. The woman told officers that she and Jones had been living together in a local hotel. She complained that he had sold her personal property, then left her Saturday night.

Jones was arrested later in a tavern.
