**THE MC CANN HOME** on North Myrtle, with its large garden and swimming pool, was designed by architect Don E. Byers of University Plan Service with Mr. Collins of Portland as interior decorator. Native materials were used to build the beautiful home. The exterior walls are surfaced with rough sawed vertical boards of Port Orford cedar, while hand-split cedar shakes cover the long sweeping roof. Extensive use of red tile formed the enormous patios and walk-ways.
