HOT SPRINGS, Va. (AP)—Patty Berg credits her putting for her victory in the \$7,500 Triangle Round Robin Invitational Golf Tournament here Sunday even though she drove only three balls into the rough and two into traps during the 90-hole "Plus and Minus" derby.

"I really practiced long and hard on my putting," said Miss Berg, long-time trouper from St. Andrews, Ill.

Miss Berg, who didn't have a poor round all the way, stacked up plus 73 points to make a runaway of the tourney. She finished 51 points ahead of runnerup Betty Jameson of San Antonio, Tex., who had plus 22 points.

Nita Baughman battered down 572 on a scratch basis, and with Joe Quants 521, they amassed a big 1,168 for second. Sylvia Anderson had high lady's series for the first night, a nice 503.

THE OFFICIAL standings aren't out yet, but Andy Anderson of the Medford Lanes gave us the rundown on winners, and Roseburg trundlers placed like this: Nita Baughman and Del Mix fourth in doubles; Evelyn Fingerlos and Mabel Clark seventh. Del Mix, ninth in singles, followed by Marguerite Rone in 13th. In all events, Nita walked off with the hardware.

In the male division, Bob Smith and Floyd Baughman copped 8th place, Willard Thompson and Ed Willets took 13th, and Parley Dillworth and Chuck McGuire, 15th. Fo Willets and Thompson thrived as the first tournament outside Roseburg, and to get in the money, and especially that far up calls for congratulations.

In singles, Dillworth placed fifth, John Wilson, 14th, Tom Hobbs 15th and McGuire 17th. Dillworth, who

has become a perennial winner everywhere took 14th in all events, and Baughman 21st.
