Funds Restored On Access Roads

WASHINGTON — Senator Guy Cordon announced today the Senate appropriations committee has voted approval of a \$3,000,000 appropriation for construction during the new fiscal year of access roads to Oregon and California grant lands timber.

The Senate committee wiped out a \$1,000,000 cut in the fund applied by the House to President Eisenhower's budget recommendation for such roads.

Cordon said he had urged restoration of the cut because of the vital need for access roads to permit control of insect infestation of O & C areas, and to permit salvage of windblown timber in this connection.

Cordon is chairman of the subcommittee which drafted the latter appropriation bill. The bill has just been approved by the full committee and will go to the floor within the next few days for action.

Mitchell Says Stand On Jimmy Still Unchanged

NEW YORK (AP) — Stephen A. Mitchell, Democratic national chairman, said Wednesday that despite the primary election victories of James Roosevelt and Rep. Robert L. Condon in California, his opposition to support for them is "unchanged."

Mitchell declined to discuss in detail the California primary, in which Roosevelt far outdistanced his rivals for the Democratic nomination for Congress in the 26th District and Condon won renomination in the 6th District.

"I am not going to add anything to my earlier statement," Mitchell said. During the California primary campaigns he had denied national committee support to the eldest son of the late President F. D. Roosevelt. He said he felt Roosevelt might prove to be a party liability as a result of no-party over his estranged wife's charges of adultery.

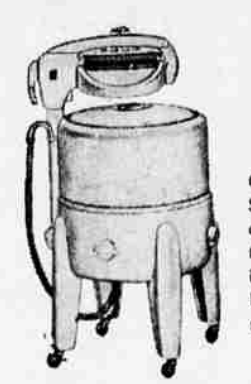

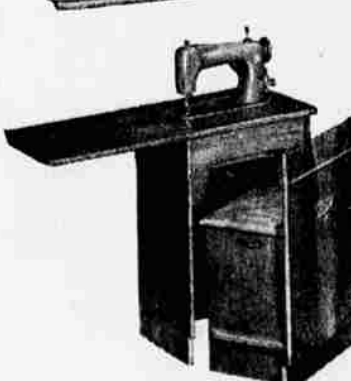

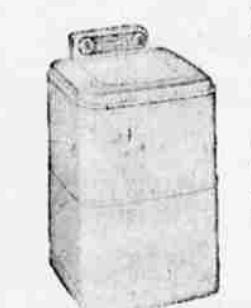
