

Mop-Up Of Wetbacks Along Border Ordered

WASHINGTON (AP) — Atty. Gen. Brownell said he is sending a greatly augmented immigration force to the Mexican border for a mop-up operation against "wetbacks" or farm laborers who have entered this country illegally. The announcement disclosed that the normal border patrol strength is being tripled for the operation, scheduled to get under way in the southern areas of California and

At the same time, Brownell said he is asking Congress for new legislation designed to provide more effective weapons in halting what he described as an ever-increasing flow of illegal entrants. The attorney-general said that "the size of the movement may well provide an effective screen for subversives and other undesirable persons to enter or depart from the United States."

Commerce, State Dept. Top Posts Recommended

WASHINGTON (AP) — Creation of 24 new top-drawer posts in the Commerce and State Departments has been recommended to the Senate by its Appropriations Committee.

The recommendation was included in a \$1,189,000,000 annual money bill for the State, Commerce and Justice Departments for the fiscal year that begins July 1. Committee action was taken Wednesday; Senate debate is scheduled for Friday.

Twenty of the new jobs, ranging from \$12,000 to \$18,000 a year, would go to the Commerce Department and eight to the State Department. The salary range is above that of the normal civil service scale, but below that of sub-cabinet jobs.

No Regrets For Shooting

WASHINGTON (AP) — Lolita Lebron was quoted Wednesday as saying she has "no regrets" for the wounding of five congressmen in the March 1 shooting spree which she led.

A statement attributed to her, introduced at her trial, added that she stands ready to "give her life for the cause of Puerto Rican freedom."

Rafael Cancel Miranda, the young man who sits at her right in the group of four defendants, said in a similar statement that he, too, "fired several shots" from the visitors' gallery in the House of Representatives, but aimed at no one in particular.

Mrs. Lebron's statement said it was her idea—which came to her on Washington's Birthday—to stage the shooting demonstration.

"I came to Washington today to claim for the freedom of my country, Puerto Rico," said a statement given to police a few hours after the bloody outbreak.

"My only motive was to attract

the attention of the people to my country and their desire for freedom."

Cancel, 25, agreed with the 34-year-old Mrs. Lebron that they wanted to dramatize their desire for Puerto Rican independence.

Washington Police Lieut. Lawrence A. Hartnett testified he took the statements from Mrs. Lebron and Cancel shortly after they were disarmed and arrested March 1. He identified three Luger pistols and a P38 pistol as the weapons with which the four Puerto Rican defendants fired an estimated 30 shots.

Earlier Wednesday, she and the three other defendants objected strenuously when their court-appointed lawyers sought to lay groundwork for possible pleas of insanity. The attorneys told newsmen afterward the four want to preserve their status as "political demonstrators."
