

Musial, Haddix Lead St. Louis To Double Win Over Pittsburgh

Imagine where the St. Louis Cardinals would be today without The Man and The Kitten. The Man, of course, is Stan Musial, the greatest hitter in the National League. The Kitten is Harvey Haddix, the best pitcher in the senior circuit.

Stan the Man and Harvey the Kitten combined their talents yesterday to give the Cardinals their first double-header victory of the season. Haddix hurled his second straight shutout and his 10th victory as the Cards defeated Pitts-

burgh 5-0 in the first game. Musial, who drove in two runs in the opener with a pair of singles, snapped a 3-3 tie in the second game with his 21st home run. The Cards went on to win 5-3.

The double victory moved the Cardinals into fifth place but they still trail the league leaders by 6½ games. The Brooklyn Dodgers and New York Giants, tied for first place, swept their double-headers.

Scoring all their runs in the seventh inning, the Dodgers overcame a 4-0 deficit to edge out Cincinnati 6-5 in the opener and came

back to run over the Redlegs 14-2 in the nightcap. The Giants thrashed the Cubs 9-3 and 9-4, breaking through for six runs in the 11th to snap a 3-3 tie in the first game.

The twin triumphs enabled the Dodgers and Giants to open up a 4½-game bulge on their nearest pursuers — Milwaukee and Philadelphia. The Braves tied the Phils for third place, defeating them 9-5 for Warren Spahn's seventh victory.

Cleveland used the lowly Boston Red Sox to boost its American League lead to 1½ games over the Chicago White Sox and 3½ over the New York Yankees. The Indians' 4-1 and 9-1 triumphs ran their latest victory string to four in a row.

After dropping their sixth straight decision to the Yankees, 4-2 in the opener of a double-header, the White Sox bounced back and thrashed the world champions 8-0. Virgil Trucks turned in his ninth triumph in the nightcap.

The Philadelphia Athletics, who had been fighting among themselves, decided to carry some of it to the opposition and as a result victories from the Detroit Tigers 4-3 and 6-4. The double win moved the Athletics out of the cellar only half a game behind the sixth-place Baltimore Orioles.

Bob Porterfield shut out Baltimore 4-0 after the Orioles had clubbed five Washington pitchers for 14 hits to take the opener 6-4.

Haddix, the 28-year-old Cardinal "stopper," struck out 10 Pirates and permitted only three singles

as he rolled up his eighth straight victory. The majors' biggest winner now owns seven complete games, half the total of the entire Cardinals' staff.

Musial, with four hits in nine times at bat, boosted his batting mark to .370, second only to Duke Sader's .378. Musial leads the

Davey Williams and Don Mueller paced the Giants' 27-hit attack against six Chicago hurlers. Williams batted in six runs in the double-header and Mueller amassed six hits and scored five times.

Andy Pafko and Del Crandall hit two-run homers to decide the free-hitting struggle between Milwaukee and Philadelphia.

Early Wynn won his seventh and Mike Gracia his eighth in Cleveland's sweep. Outfielder Wally Westlake homered in each game for the victors.

A three-run homer by Gene Woodling in the sixth enabled the Yankees' Ed Lopat to register his seventh triumph of the year. The White Sox pounced on starter Harry Byrd for four runs in the first inning of the nightcap.

Elmer Valo, who replaced Gus Zernial in the Philadelphia outfield, drove in four runs with a bases-loaded triple and a single to provide the A's winning margin in the second game. Manager Eddie Joost's benching of the erratic fielding Zernial had led to a verbal battle between the manager and the leftfielder the other day.

2,500 Golfers Defeat Hogan

NEW YORK (AP) — Some 2,500 golfers were entitled Monday to wear a medal inscribed "I Beat Ben Hogan" despite the U.S. Open champion's blaring 64 over Batusoro's lower course at Springfield, N.J.

Some 165,000 golfers, paying one dollar each, attempted to beat Hogan by using their handicaps in

WIL Leaders Ponder Moves

SPOKANE (AP) — The Western International Baseball League, after declaring the Spokane franchise forfeited, stayed in session until well after midnight Monday trying to reach a decision on the fate of the "orphaned" club.

League president Robert B. Abel said the announcement of any decisions would have to wait until about 10:00 a.m.

The league forfeited the Spokane franchise Sunday, but tentatively agreed to "carry" the club for another week in hopes a community ownership plan could be worked out here.

But there were reports that the Spokane players would not make the trip to Canada for their next games until they had received their full back pay.

The community ownership plan was advanced by a civic committee working to keep baseball in a city that once set minor league attendance records.

Abel said if the group is not successful the league will operate with nine teams or try to place the franchise in another city.

The directors lifted the franchise after Roy Hotchkiss, owner of the Spokane club, announced he would not operate the team after Sunday night's game with Salem.

Hotchkiss, who Saturday night reported he had turned down \$150,000 for his interests in the club, Sunday set a \$225,000 price on the operation.

Hotchkiss gave poor attendance, which has plagued all clubs in the league, and his own poor health as reasons for his decision to get out of baseball.

Before Sunday's meeting, there were reports the league would disband if Edmonton and Calgary, Alta., the league's "farthest north" members, remained in the circuit. However, the clubs refused to quit.

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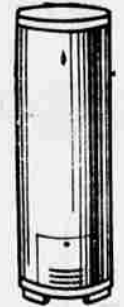
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
