Cold Coffee Lends Flavor To This Pie

Even a quarter-cup of left-over coffee shouldn't be thrown away these days, and it doesn't have to be. Use it to make this unusual and delicious pie for dessert. Even though the coffee blends so well with the almond flavor that it's only hinted at, you'll find that it gives the pie a subtle affinity for the fresh hot coffee served with it.

Coffee-Macaroni Pie
 1/4 teaspoon salt
 3 eggs, separated
 1 1/2 cups sugar
 1/4 cup left-over coffee
 1 1/2 cups shredded coconut, cut
 2 tablespoons butter or margarine, melted
 1 teaspoon lemon juice
 1/4 teaspoon almond extract
 1 unbaked 9-inch pie shell
 Add salt to egg yolks and beat until thick and lemon-colored. Add sugar, 1/4 cup at a time, beating well after each addition. Add coffee, butter, lemon juice and almond extract. Blend well. Fold in coconut and stiffly beaten egg whites. Turn into pie shell. Bake in moderate oven, 375 degrees F., 50 minutes or until inserted knife comes out clean. Cool before serving.

Summer Brings Polio Fears; Symptoms, Precautions Told

These are the symptoms of lots of minor illnesses. Don't jump to the conclusion your child has polio just because he has a headache and a fever. It's much more likely to be a throat infection or flu or a stomach upset than polio.

However, it's a good idea to have your child seen by a doctor whenever he gets sick. Mild illnesses and serious ones often start the same way.

If you can't get to the doctor right away, there are two simple tests that may reassure you. If your child can bend his head so that his chin touches his chest, and if he can put his head between his knees, he probably doesn't have polio. Even if he can't do these tests, it isn't sure that he has polio.

Ice Box Cookie Cake
 1 package vanilla pudding and pie filling mix
 1 envelope (1 tablespoon) gelatin
 1 1/2 cups cold water
 1 pint vanilla ice cream
 1/2 cup moist mince
 20 shortbread cookies (1 box)

Combine pudding mix, gelatin and cold water in saucepan. Cook and stir over medium heat until mixture comes to a full boil. Remove from heat. Cool 5 minutes, stirring once or twice. Then add ice cream by spoonfuls, stirring after each addition until ice cream is melted. Chill 10 to 15 minutes, or until mixture is slightly thickened. Fold in mince.

Place 4 cookies in the bottom of a lightly greased 9 x 5-inch loaf pan. Spoon one-third of the pudding over the cookies. Arrange 8 cookies on top of pudding. Continue to layer pudding with cookies, finishing with pudding. Chill until firm (at least 1 hour).

To unmold, draw a knife or spatula around sides of pan. Turn cake onto serving plate. Garnish the base with a futing of sweetened whipped cream. Anchor halves of pecans in the cream and divide 8 pecans.

Robert Young Regime Takes Central Control

NEW YORK (AP)—The new regime of Robert R. Young buckled down today to the formidable task of running the nation's second largest railroad, the far-flung New York Central system.

Young and his board took over yesterday, an hour after they were officially proclaimed winner by 1,064,000 shares in their proxy battle with the management headed by William White.

The new board quickly elected Young as chairman—at \$1 a year—and named Alfred E. Perlmutter, 51-year-old executive vice president of the Denver & Rio Grande Western, as president and chief executive officer.

School Election At Glide Slated Monday 2-8 p.m.

The annual school board election of the Glide School District 12, of one director for a 5-year term will be held Monday, June 21, between 2 p.m. and 8 p.m. Voting places will be at the High School, Deer Creek Elementary School and Toketee Falls School.

The only name placed on the ballot by petition is Howard Hatfield, but other names may be written in. Hatfield has served as chairman of the school board during the past year and is completing a three-year term as director.

A delegation from the Roberts Creek School District attended the meeting of the Glide school board last Monday to request consolidation with the Glide School District. The board members discussed the matter, but took no action to support or oppose the request. It was agreed that the proponents of consolidation, have the right to put the question before the voters of both districts if the required number of signatures can be obtained to call an election.

Brownies Call For Mocha

Brownies
 2/3 cup sifted flour
 1/2 teaspoon double-acting baking powder
 1/4 teaspoon salt
 1/3 cup butter or other shortening
 2 squares unsweetened chocolate
 1 cup sugar
 2 eggs, well beaten
 1/4 cup broken walnuts
 1 teaspoon vanilla

Sift flour once measure, add baking powder and salt, and sift again. Melt shortening and chocolate over hot water. Add sugar gradually to eggs, beating thoroughly. Add chocolate mixture and blend. Add flour and mix well; then add nuts and vanilla. Spread in greased 8x8x2-inch pan. Bake in moderate oven (350 degrees F.) 25 minutes, or until done. Cool in pan. Frost with Chocolate Mocha Frosting; then cut into squares or rectangles. Makes about 20 brownies.

Chocolate Mocha Frosting
 1 tablespoon butter or other shortening
 2 1/2 cups sifted confectioners' sugar
 1 square unsweetened chocolate, melted
 Dash of salt
 1/4 cup strong coffee (about)

Cream butter; add part of sugar gradually, blending after each addition. Add chocolate and salt, and mix well. Add remaining sugar.

Turkey, Pakistan Plan Alliance Strengthening

ANKARA, Turkey (AP)—Turkey and Pakistan plan to launch military talks immediately to put more teeth in their alliance.

A communique at the conclusion of talks here between Pakistan Premier Mohammed Ali and Turkish Premier Menderes said the two nations would make their pact more effective by "searching the possibilities and determining the extent of defense cooperation in case of a nonprovoked attack coming from abroad and directed against one or the other country."

The communique said experts of the two nations' general staffs would begin talks immediately to establish defense plans, exchanges of information, and plans for filling the two countries' arms and ammunition needs.

Marie Lounie, a niece, of Camas Valley, was named executrix and Oscar Ohlsen was named appraiser of the real property.

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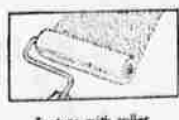
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
