BOSTON (AP)—George D. O'Brien, 44, a man with a lengthy police record who two months ago was acquitted of participating in one of the country's major unsolved thefts — \$681,700 from an untended armored truck in 1952 — was found shot through the head Thursday.

City Hospital doctors held little hope for his recovery.

Police indicated belief the wound was self-inflicted.
