Umpqua District Of Garden Clubs Given Approval

The Umpqua District, the 16th of the Oregon Federated Garden Clubs, has been given approval, and Mrs. C. J. Belman of Sutherlin is the new district director.

The action occurred at a recent state meeting of the federation in Ashland.

The district comprises seven garden clubs—at Oakland, Sutherlin, Camas Valley, Roseburg, Winston and Days Creek. The Roseburg club is the Town and Country Garden Club and the Riverend Garden Club. The club at Winston is the Rainbow Garden Club. An eighth club is being organized at Glendale.

The clubs were formerly part of the Willamette District. At the state meeting, the Sutherlin club was awarded a first prize for a handpainted book on Oregon birds.

At a regional meeting preceding the state meeting, representatives from Washington, Idaho, Oregon, California, Arizona and New Mexico decided to launch a campaign against "litterbugs."

Miss Elaine Hanley of Medford was elected new state president. Main speaker was Marshall Dana of Portland, former Oregon Journal editor.

Delegates from the Roseburg Town and Country Garden Club were Mrs. L. E. Adams, Mrs. T. L. Goodwin and Mrs. O. J. Feldkamp.

Helicopters In Britain Start Shuttle Flights

LONDON — Helicopters hovered over the heart of London Thursday and landed on the south bank of the Thames, starting something new in British aviation.

The new airframe shuttle is a prelude to a helicopter passenger service which British European Airways plans to institute next March between downtown Waterloo Station and the London airport, 15½ miles away.

Regulations which had sharply restricted flights in the city area were relaxed. The first helicopter landed on the river bank, just a few hundred yards from the busy Strand. It picked up newspapers and whisked them off to an airport for distribution by conventional planes.
