Soviets Now Claiming First Jet Plane Flight

LONDON — A Russian, Radio Moscow said Thursday, was the first to fly in a jet plane.

In a Soviet Aviation Day broadcast, the voice of the Soviet Union said:

"In 1942 the Soviet airman Bakchivanzhi was the first in the world to perform a flight in a jet aircraft, which was of home design by Bokhovinov and provided with jet motor by Dushkin, thus establishing priority for our country in the field of application of jet-propelled aircraft."

The broadcast made no mention of Air Commodore Frank Whittle, British inventor who started research in jet propulsion in 1935 and had jet engines pushing Gloster planes around the skies in 1941.

Settlement Offer Made Barbara

NEW YORK — Barbara Sears (Bobo) Rockefeller departed her Park Avenue apartment Thursday — presumably for Reno and an end to her Cinderella marriage.

The coal miner's daughter who married into one of America's greatest fortunes was silent. But sources close to the domestic tangle said her lawyers and those of husband Winthrop Rockefeller reached a financial settlement and divorce agreement Wednesday night.

They said she will get 5 1/2 million dollars, plus a \$500,000 trust fund. The 35-year-old blonde will have custody of the couple's son, Winthrop Paul Rockefeller, 5, but the father will have fixed visitation rights.

In January, Rockefeller offered her either a \$500,000 trust fund or a fixed \$70,000 a year income in addition to the 5 1/2 million dollars, and Wednesday night she elected to take the trust fund.

Adlai Stevenson Plans Speeches In Northwest

WASHINGTON — Adlai Stevenson plans a series of political speeches in the Pacific Northwest and Alaska next month.

The Democratic National Committee announced the party's 1952 presidential candidate will go to Portland the first week of July to visit friends.

The schedule will send Stevenson to Eugene, Ore. July 10 to speak on behalf of Richard Neuberger, Democratic nominee for the seat held by Sen. Cordon (R-Ore) and other Democratic candidates.

The national committee said Stevenson will also speak either in Spokane or Seattle on a date to be set by Washington State Democratic leaders. He will sail for Alaska July 14 and will make a major speech at Anchorage July 24.
