Natural Gas Decision Blow To Portland Firm

PORTLAND — The decision of the Federal Power Commission to permit gas to be piped from the San Juan Basin to the Pacific Northwest was a defeat for the Portland Gas Co., biggest gas distributor in the Northwest, which had backed a Canadian proposal. Charles H. Gueffroy, president of the Portland firm, said he would defer direct comment, but pointed out that both leading pipeline contenders had spent a million dollars in promoting their plans and the loser, Westcoast Transmission Co., Inc., might well go to court to upset the FPC decision. Westcoast would have brought in Canadian gas. Gueffroy's firm contended that the Canadian gas would be both cheaper and available in greater volume.

Richland Hearing To End On City's Disposition

RICHLAND — Richland residents had their final chance Saturday to tell Rep. W. Sterling Cole (R-NY) what they think about a bill which would turn their atomic city over to private ownership. Cole, chairman of the Senate-House Joint Atomic Energy Committee, will wind up a two-day, one-man hearing here Saturday night. Two committee aides came here with him.

Friday, the president of the Richland City Council suggested inclusion of two provisions in the measure: (1) Setting up an appeal board for persons dissatisfied with appraised values of their property, and (2) Obliging the Atomic Energy Commission to buy back property from persons who lost or quit their jobs.

Soviet Savings Banks Get Knuckles Rapped

MOSCOW — For want of a ruble, the Soviet state savings banks have had their knuckles rapped by Ivestia. The Soviet government's official newspaper told the story of a schoolboy who had four rubles — a dollar at the official exchange rate. He wanted to open a savings account so some day he could buy a home aquarium.

Bank workers, Ivestia grumbled, "are too used to dealing with big depositors." The paper added: "The state savings banks must attract small deposits and learn themselves to count not only in tens of rubles but also in kopeck (1/10 cent) coins. It is necessary to raise up children in the spirit of thrift."

BRITAIN REJECTS REQUEST LONDON — Britain disclosed Friday she has rejected an American request for power to search British vessels which may be carrying arms to Guatemala. But Britain promised at the same time to undertake police action on the high seas to stop any British ships bound with arms to Guatemalan ports.

McCarthyism Not Issue In Maine Primary Vote

PORTLAND, Maine — Despite the advance ballyhoo, it looked today — 48 hours before Monday's Maine primary — as if Sen. McCarthy might not have much impact after all on a contest in this state for the Republican nomination to the Senate.

The candidates are Sen. Margaret Chase Smith of Skowhegan, seeking a second term, and Robert L. Jones of Biddeford, a former office seeker. McCarthy looked like a potential issue when Jones at the outset of his campaign praised the Wisconsin Republican's concepts of Americanism. But as the campaign progressed, Jones made few references to McCarthy. Mrs. Smith didn't refer at all to the Wisconsin senator by name. She criticized conditions making for discord in government.
