Pearl Harbor Attack Planner Given Post

TOKYO — A Japanese Navy captain who mapped the air strategy for the attack on Pearl Harbor will be the chief planner for Japan's new air force, press reports said Wednesday.

Newspapers said the appointment of Sadamu Sanagi to the important post would be announced about July 1, when Japan's present "safety" force becomes a "self defense" force.
