Dispersal Of Spokane Players Just Started

SPOKANE (AP) — The job of dispersing players on the defunct Spokane team of the Western International Baseball League is just beginning, Manager Don Osborn said Wednesday.

Most of the players are owned by the Philadelphia Phillies of the National League and Osborn said he still is waiting for word from them on where to send the players. Osborn said he himself hopes to get some assignment in baseball, but believes it is too late in the season to get a managerial post.

New System In Handling Deer Meat Under Trial

A new system for handling deer meat received by the Oregon State Game Commission has not only made for better handling of the meat, but also made the work involved less complicated. The program was developed through cooperation with the Oregon State Board of Control.

The meat is received from various parts of the state when it is confiscated from violators or salvaged when an animal is hit by a car. Formerly, the meat was all shipped to the Portland office of the commission where it was then sold or disposed of, depending on the condition in which it arrived.

The new agreement which is in trial operation at present provides that the meat from western Oregon shall be shipped to Salem and the meat from east of the Cascades to the Oregon State Hospital at Pendleton for state institutional use.

Fishing Closure On North Umpqua To Be Discussed

Two proposed fishing regulation changes will be discussed preceding the annual game regulation public hearing July 9 at the game commission headquarters in Portland.

At 9 a.m. a proposed closure on the North Umpqua River near Soda Springs Dam will be discussed, followed by comments on a suggested increase in the bag limit at Unity Reservoir.

The closure has been considered because of the concentrations of salmon that are found immediately below the dam, which is an impassable barrier.

A 30 fish per day and 60 fish in 7 consecutive days limit would be placed on Unity Reservoir in order to give fishermen a chance to harvest as many of the fish as possible. Because of the heavy reinfestation of the reservoir by scrap fish, it is to be chemically treated this fall.

Following the discussion of these two fisheries items, proposals for the 1954 hunting regulations will be presented and tentative rules drawn up.

Archie Moore, recognized as the 175-pound champ everywhere else, had his title in Pennsylvania declared "vacant" Friday by Chairman Frank Wiener of the State Athletic Commission because Moore has failed to defend the crown against Philadelphia's Harold Johnson, the No. 1 challenger.

Hunting Regulations To Be Printed On Map

The Oregon State Game Commission has approved a new type of hunting synopsis for this fall. Instead of the familiar booklet, used for many years, the regulations will be printed on the back side of a map with hunting area boundaries marked for clarity and easier understanding. The regulations for 1954 will not

be available until about Sept. 1 since they cannot be printed until after two public hearings are held in July and final adoption of the 1954 hunting regulations by the commission.

The commission asks that persons desiring information on hunting seasons wait until after that time to make inquiry. The synopses of the hunting regulations will be distributed to the license agencies as soon as available.

Hurler Switches From Hollywood To Seattle

SEATTLE (AP) — Bob Hall, who wore a Hollywood uniform only last week, may be pitching against the Pacific Coast League leaders in their series at Seattle this week.

The Rainiers announced Tuesday they have purchased the husky righthander from the Pittsburgh Pirates.

Hall pitched for Seattle in 1951 and 1952 and was drafted by the Pirates in 1953. The Pirates optioned Hall to Hollywood after baseball commissioner Ford Frick voided a deal that would have returned him to the Rainiers in mid-season last year. He has won four and lost nine at Hollywood this season.

1,129 Series Bowled Wednesday At Alleys

Claudia Jarvey and Joe Quant made up the top mixed doubles team at the Roseburg Bowling Alley Wednesday night.

Falling Rainiers Call Three From WL Loop

SEATTLE (AP) — The Seattle Rainiers, floundering in fifth place in the Pacific Coast Baseball League, summoned three players from the Western International League Wednesday in an effort to strengthen the roster.

General manager Dewey Soriano said outfielder K. Chorlton is being recalled from Vancouver, outfielder Joe Joshua from Victoria and catcher Lloyd Jenney from Wenatchee.

The Rainiers are sending veteran pitcher Pete Hernandez to Vancouver in exchange for Chorlton, Soriano said.

DEATH OF A TOURNEY

NEW YORK (AP) — Metropolitan New York and New Jersey golfers who shoot holes-in-one no longer have an ace tournament in which they can try to outshoot each other. After 29 years the New York World-Telegram and Sun have discontinued its golf promotion.

"The event has become just too large to handle," says the newspaper. Since last August, when a record 1,461 participated, 532 new entries were registered.

The odds for an ace in this tournament turned out to be 8,606 to 1. Since the event began in 1932, a total of 17,211 players have hit 86,055 iron shots on par, 5 holes. Their efforts produced 10 aces.

Oldest hole-in-one in the event was Ernie Grauer's shot in 1932. It hit a fence behind the green and rebounded into the cup.

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
