Janet Harpham, Patsy Williams Attend Assembly

Janet Harpham, twin daughter of Mr. and Mrs. V. V. Harpham, 1702 East Douglas Street, and Patsy Williams, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Emery Williams, Rt. 1, 144 Austin Road, Roseburg, will attend Westminster Fellowship National Assembly meeting at the University of Illinois, June 20-July 6. They will be among 1200 young persons representing over 500,000 youth of the Presbyterian Church. These young people have invited more than 500 adult teachers, ministers, business and professional and other lay leaders of the church to join them for a week of study and discussion of Christian living in a world of day to day crisis.

Miss Harpham, who has been active in Westminster Fellowship and has served as a commissioner, will represent Oregon State College, while Miss Williams will be a delegate from Roseburg. Patsy is moderator of Southwest Oregon Youth Presbytery and also vice moderator of the State Youth Synod.

At Urbana, the Westminster Fellowship Assembly will be addressed by Dr. Charles T. Leber, general secretary of the Presbyterian Board of Foreign Missions who has completed a recent tour to study new missionary strategy; Professor Alexander Miller of

Stanford University, Palo Alto; of Dallas, Tex., will guide the daily Bible study of the Assembly. The two from Roseburg will make the trip east via the northern route. They will spend a day in Minneapolis, Minn., and Chicago. Following the assembly they will go to New Orleans and stop at the Carlsbad Caverns enroute home.

Robert Gene White, 19, Gets 90-Day Jail Term

Robert Gene White, 19, Roseburg, was sentenced Friday to serve 90 days in the Douglas County jail after pleading guilty in circuit court to taking an automobile without the consent of the owner.

He was charged with taking a car on May 21 belonging to Don Morgan of 110 N. Flint St., Roseburg. Circuit Judge Barnett Goldstein ruled that only 44 more days of the sentence need be served by White. The 46 days he has already spent in jail will be included as retro-active time on the sentence.
