Makes Business Trip — S. M. Moore of Roseburg made a business trip to Portland this week.

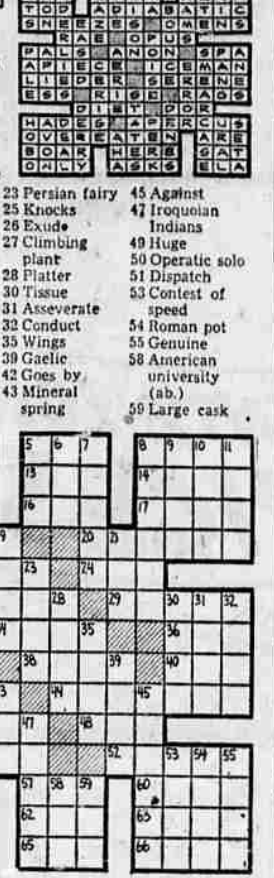
