Willamette River Flow Diverted By Conduits

PORTLAND — The flow of the Middle Fork of the Willamette River between Dexter and Lookout Point dams is being diverted from its main channel into temporary conduits in the base of the Dexter spillway.

Portland district Army Engineers expect the flow to be completely diverted some time this month. Then the main river channel will be closed off permanently with an earthenfill structure, butting against the concrete Dexter spillway structure, and a pool between Dexter and Lookout Point, two miles upstream will be formed.

The work is part of the Willamette Basin project, which includes both flood control and power-generating facilities.

Japanese Rescue Ship Enters Russian Waters

TOKYO — Four controversial bills jammed through the Diet recently by Prime Minister Shigeru Yoshida Thursday ushered postwar Japan into its third rearmament stage.

They brought into being (1) Land, sea and air forces set up to combat direct and indirect aggression; (2) a joint chiefs of staff; (3) a centralized police system and (4) a law making military espionage a criminal offense.

Immediately after World War II Japan had only a lightly armed national police reserve armed to quell civil riots. Later the police reserves became security forces with land and sea units equipped to meet indirect aggression.

Thursday the security forces gave way to new self defense forces with an air arm added for the first time.

College Summer Session Enrollment Shows Climb

EUGENE — Summer session registrations are up 11.5 per cent over last year on the campuses of the state system of higher education.

The chancellor's office reported Thursday that 5,617 were enrolled compared with 5,039 at the same time last year.

The Portland summer session has 1,556, up 16.7; University of Oregon 1,542, up 12.1; Eastern Oregon 333, up 13.7; Oregon College 757, up 11.6; Oregon State 921, up 7.1; and Southern Oregon 488, up 1.6.

Senate Confirms Mint

Appointee Of Eisenhower

WASHINGTON — The Senate Friday confirmed President Eisenhower's nomination of William H. Brett of Ohio to be director of the mint for a term of five years.

Also confirmed were: John H. Winchell of Colorado to be a member of the Interstate Commerce Commission for the remainder of a term expiring Dec. 31, 1960.

Rep. Secrest (D-Ohio) to be a member of the Federal Trade Commission for a seven-year term from Sept. 26, 1954.

Sheldon T. Mills of Oregon to be ambassador to Ecuador.

'Gunsmoke' Show Due On Mondays
